The problem in today's world is that there is virtually no moral clarity about almost anything. The governments are Godless. Relativism is in full swing so there can be no greater authority than the one I nominate. And I, myself am up high, if not at the top, of the pile. I am the God of me

This is the thinking that has created a crisis of hope in the contemporary world. When there's no God, there's no hope and that leads to the inevitable expansion of war. We're seeing it everywhere now. The tyrants have been given permission to have their way, to establish their will.

So who's responsible for all this war? Well, for starters, I am. I have sinned. I am a sinner. And almost everyone who walks on this earth is responsible because we are all sinners, with the exception of Jesus and his Mother Mary.

And how do we stop this crazy cycle of vengeance and revenge? The situation in Israel, for example, has been worked on by the greatest minds and the most skillful of diplomats and statesmen and it has only gotten worse over time. From a standpoint, geo-political it is intractable situation and it appears there will never be a winner and everyone will lose. The fact is, there is no human way to end this conflict because it has descended to a place that is beyond the ability of men and women to stop it.

It can only change by the grace of God.

Peace starts in my own heart. And I have peace in my own heart when I repent for my sins and atone for them through acts of sacrifice and prayer.

And that is why I have started opening the church up for Eucharistic Adoration all day, as long as people will come and pray. I will keep the church open as long as there are two people committing to prayer.



The world is in a sorry state. It even has the angels crying. Let us throw ourselves down before the Lord and beg for forgiveness for our sins and for all the sins of mankind. 


