Canada Day and Culture

Happy Canada Day! Interestingly our nation of Canada was founded by two completely separate cultures. And those cultures came into a place that already had a life and a culture living on these shores and throughout the vast land of Kanata, or otherwise known as Turtle Island. Unfortunately, that aboriginal culture was mostly pushed off to the side while the warring factions of the other two cultures battled it out for supremacy of the land. They kind of came to a draw.

Canada, because of the divide that existed between the French and the English has been known as a land of "two solitudes" principally because of the lack of true communication and trust of the two founding peoples and thus remained two separate cultures.

Today the "culture of Canada" is hard to identify because of the changing face of Canada throughout the years brought on by many waves of immigration and is comprised of a diverse collection of cultures and sub-cultures. To say Canadian culture is diverse is understatement.



Our parish is a reflection of this diversity. Notre Dame de Lourdes was founded by French-Canadian people who came from back east, mostly from Quebec. French was the language and the culture of the parish and the neighborhood of Maillardville until well into the 1960's and 70's, when things gradually changed just as they had throughout Canada.

Today when you look around in the pews at your fellow parishioners, you will see a Francophones, some Filipinos, Chinese, folks from Sudan, Peru, Viet Nam, Mexico. There are Irish people, Italians, East Indians and more. And everybody comes with their own cultural background.




