I currently have two working series, plein aire paintings and collage paintings. I enjoy setting up an easel and painting in nature with my wife and kids. I think of these on location paintings as a form of meditation they become a two hour observation recorded in paint.

The painted collage work is inspired by my love of science fiction. I recently read Gerard O'neil's book the High Frontier and discovered the phrase space island. The concept of a self enclosed isolated habitat connected to other isolated cells via internet is analogous to my experience of this strange time of quarantine.

I live in Rocky Point with my wife Michelle where we create art and teach together. As co-proprietor of StudioE, a local Art Education center, I teach drawing, painting and ceramics to children and adults. I also enjoy participating in local live painting and collaborative art events.
