Responsible Coaching Movement (RCM) Policies

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The Croatia Norval Soccer Club follows has taken a pledge to adhere to and follow the Coaches Association of Canada's Responsible Coaching Movement (RCM). Croatia Norval Soccer Club invites all our coaches to learn and apply consistent safety principles that include the three (3) distinct pillars, each serving to create a sports environment that is Safe, Smart and Secure.

Croatia Norval Soccer Club has implemented and maintains the following procedures in the day-to-day policies of the club:

- 1. <u>The Rule of Two:</u> A safe sports environment ensures all coaches, staff, and administrators apply the Rule of Two. When following the Rule of Two, all interactions and communications with participants are in open, observable, and justifiable settings, and two responsible adults, whether a coach, parent, staff or screened volunteer, are present. There may be exceptions in emergency situations.
- 2. <u>Background Screening:</u> A secure sports environment is one where all coaches and sports organization leaders are screened to meet the requirements to be involved in sports. Screening includes comprehensive background and reference checks, interviews, and police information checks, to be done at regular intervals. Croatia Norval SC insists on new and updated Vulnerable Sector Police Checks every three (3) years.
- 3. Ethics Training: A smart sports environment ensures coaches are trained and have the confidence and skills needed to effectively manage challenging situations. Lifelong learning through numerous training modules helps coaches expand their knowledge and awareness of important topics throughout their careers. Croatia Norval SC has made it mandatory that all Head Coaches and their Assistants complete all 4 of the NCCP pre-requisites:
 - Making Ethical Decisions (MED), Making Headway in Soccer, Respect in Sports and Emergency Action Plan (EAP). It is also recommended that coaches leading female programs take the "Keeping Girls in Sport" module.
