How Do I Get Licensed in Maryland?

For MARYLAND Licensure:

To obtain your real estate license in the state of Maryland, you are required by law to take a 64-hour course entitled "Principles & Practices of Real Estate for Salespersons"..

All materials needed to study and pass the licensing exam required by the state of Maryland will be covered in this comprehensive class.
