Department. He is currently going through the pre-employment requirements. Chief McIntosh stated that once the requirements are fulfilled, he anticipates Mr. Evans starting in the upcoming week. With the hiring of Mr. Evans, this will bring the department to seven Full Time Officers and one SRO.

ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT:

> Engineer's report -

Administrator Bailey reported that Mr. Haibach is still recovering and Assistant Village Engineer, Mr. Lubonovic is out due to the birth of his baby girl, Amelia. Mr. Bailey reported that there is pipe going into the ground for the Sanitary Sewer Interconnect Project. He stated that he is very happy with the work that Chivers Construction is doing on the project. The temporary connection with the lift station has been made which will later be taken out when we tie into the County's system. The Contractor is getting ready to bore under the creek on Middle Ridge Road and they have cleaned out the trees in front of the condos. He went on to say that there is one more easement left that has been verbally agreed to, just waiting on the signatures.

He reported that an additional \$73,000.00 was received from the CDBG fund for the Dana's Park playground project.

Fiscal Officer's report –

Mrs. Crockett reported that she is continuing to work on year end. She stated that last year she received a one-time payment of \$50,000.00 for the Senior Center. She recently received notification from the Lake County Board of Commissioners that that have done another one-time allocation payment of \$50,000.00 for 2023. The total allocation for Senior Levy money is \$143,500.00. The only stipulation with the additional \$50,000.00 is that is it not used for personnel services.

Police Chief's report –

Chief McIntosh thanked Council for passing the resolution hiring Mr. Evans. He reported that with the recent winter storm, there weren't too many power outages or accidents.

In closing, he reported that he is continuing to work on year end.

> Administrator's report -

Administrator Bailey stated that with the recent winter storm, the Road Department did a phenomenal job taking care of the roads. He stated that with only having three guys in the department, the Village roads are the best kept in the County.

Councilman Vest added that not only do they do a great job on the roads, the downtown area looks wonderful with the decorations that they put up. He stated that he has received many compliments from residents.

He did urge residents to pull their garbage and recycling toters back up to the house when there is bad weather. It makes it a bit more challenging for the guys to plow when the toters are close to the road.

Several Councilmembers stated they were pleased to see the Waste Management drivers going above and beyond as well.
