



FROM THE PASTOR

Nothing Ordinary about "Ordinary Time" this Summer! The late Winter/Early Spring of the Church Year is a time filled with Church Festivals and Commemorations! We move from our Christmas celebrations to the Day of Epiphany, and then quickly to Ash Wednesday, the Lenten Season, Holy Week, and then – the "Queen of all Festivals" – Easter Day. From there, it's a short step to Pentecost Sunday and the Holy Trinity. But then – the Summer arrives and the Church Festivals come to a close. Our paraments turn to green and REMAIN green throughout the three months of Summer.



Our Episcopal Brothers and Sisters refer to the Season after Pentecost (the Lutheran term for this time) as "Ordinary Time" – it's a time when the Church focuses on the Ministry and Teachings of Jesus. This year our Gospel Reading for the Summer Season will be from St. Matthew.

This "Ordinary Time" can feel like a break from the High Holy Festivals of Christmas/ Easter/Pentecost. But it's not an ordinary time at all. During this Summer Season we will follow Jesus in His Ministry as Matthew describes it. For St. Matthew, Jesus is the Promised Messiah who comes to fulfill the Jewish Law in all that He says and does. In addition to following Matthew, we'll be reading through St. Paul's Epistle to the Romans during this Summer, which is probably the Letter Paul is most remembered for – and his Letter that was most beloved and studied by Martin Luther.

And so I invite you to seek God in the ordinary rhythm of the Church Year this Summer. Immerse yourself in the worship life of the church, and in the fellowship we're able to share together as we enjoy these Summer months. As usual at Kimball Memorial, there are always opportunities to seek God's presence and peace through prayer, learning, and service.

I am excited to step into this Season with you – and to be met by God's presence and power in the Sundays of June, July, and August. *Peace and Love, Pastor John*

A TAX SAVING WAY TO HELP THE

ENDOWMENT FUND If you are 70 1/2 years old and older, you can give any amount (up to a maximum of \$100,000) per year from your IRA directly to a qualified charity such as your church and/or the ministries you specify without having to pay income taxes on the money. Gifts of any value \$100,000 or less are eligible for this benefit, and you can feel good knowing that you are making a difference at Kimball! This popular gift option is commonly called the IRA Charitable Rollover, but you may also see it referred to as a qualified charitable distribution, or QCD for short.

Why Consider this Gift?

- Your gift will be put to use today, allowing you to see the difference your donation is making.
- If you are required to take minimum distributions, you can use your gift to satisfy all or part of your RMD obligation.
- You pay no income taxes on the gift. The transfer generates neither taxable income nor a tax deduction, so you benefit even if you do not itemize your deductions.
- Since the gift doesn't count as income, it can reduce your annual income level. This may help lower your Medicare premiums and decrease the amount of Social Security that is subject to tax.

It is critical to let us know of your gift, because many popular retirement plan administrators assume no obligation to notify a charity of your designation. The administrator also will not monitor whether your gift designations are followed. Your regional gift planner, Stephanie Burke with the ELCA Foundation Services, would love to thank you for your generosity and talk with you about your intentions to ensure that they are followed. And, as always, please feel free to reach out to the Endowment Committee if we can help!

Staff and committees are doing a great job controlling spending, but we have been forced to use some of the reserves we have accumulated for just this type of event. Thankfully, the church did receive a very large one-time donation recently with which we were able to replenish the reserves and catch up on our projections. With the summer months approaching, which has historically been a low offering part of the year, we ask that you prayerfully keep Kimball in mind as you make summer plans. 


