We are now servicing the Blessing Box multiple times during the week - a sure sign that it is being used by those who need it the most. Doing so regularly means that we have begun to develop a relationship with some "regulars" who have come to depend on this Blessing Box on a weekly basis. The needs are many and varied, and you will always find them listed in our bulletin for the week: Everything from pudding cups, oatmeal packets, and bottles of water, to tissues, deodorant, soap and toothpaste. As Autumn approaches, we are being challenged to "think outside the box" by including easy grab and go items that require no preparation (granola bars, packages of snack crackers, etc.) as well as "seasonal items" such as coats, sweaters, warm socks, and sleeping bags). The items will continue to be updated and your help and participation are encouraged and appreciated. During this month of September we really hope that you'll bring your items and place them in the pantry located in the educational building in the back corner - the old Joe Gribble Sunday School Class. We also can always use more folks willing to fill the Blessing Box. 
Godly, biblical wisdom is more valuable than gold or silver. Make this do-it-yourself toy to practice your searching skills.



- 12 small, smooth rocks
- An empty, clean egg carton
- Paintbrush
- Acrylic paint (gold or silver)
- Black permanent marker

What you do:

- 1. Clean the rocks and egg carton. Place newspaper on a table to protect it from paint.
- 2. Paint all sides of the rocks and carton. Let dry. Add a second coat, if desired.
- 3. When rocks are dry, number each rock (1-12) with marker. Place rocks in the carton.
- 4. Play hide-and-seek with a friend. Take turns hiding the rocks in a room, sandbox or backyard. Give clues, if needed, and count the rocks as they're returned.
