





- Control your blood pressure to prevent heart attack, stroke, and heart failure. Normal blood pressure is 120/80.



Diastolic (bottom number)

- 6. Keep a healthy cholesterol level. Together with other substances, cholesterol can form a thick, hard deposit called plaque that can narrow the arteries and make them less flexible. This condition is known as atherosclerosis. If a clot forms and blocks a narrowed artery, a heart attack or stroke can result. Have your cholesterol checked every four years.
- Control high blood sugar. Over time, high levels of blood sugar can damage you
 heart, kidneys, eyes and nerves, and increase the risk of diabetes. Diabetes
 alone is a very serious risk factor for heart disease.
