I listened to the music of John Denver so much growing up that I can still sing along with many of the songs without needing the lyrics. There used to be a closet for all of dad's records, turntable, sound system and speakers. (For those younger than 20 reading this, I invite you to Google any of those terms for definitions if I'm speaking ancient Greek to you.) I remember sitting in the "sound room" with the doors closed and singing with the music turned up loud or with headphones on, and my mom or dad opening the doors to tell me that dinner was ready or it was time for bed and telling me to "come out of the closet!" Little did we know back then!

Those songs from the 1970s and 80s shaped much of my ideals and understandings of life, hope, community, relationships, grief, work, play and so much more. Every part of my growing up, my faith, my relationships were grounded in something far greater than me and my understanding. I found meaning for my life and experience as I looked at the whole of life, not just the segmented parts.

The John Denver song, All This Joy (1989), spoke to me. It was released the year my first child was born. I remember sitting in my living room in the parsonage and hearing it for the first time, late on a December evening as I held my infant daughter, trying to get her back to sleep. Becoming a parent and looking at this little bundle of preciousness and blessing forever changed me. I looked at her and saw the potential and opportunity of life and hope as never before.

When I first found out I was going to be a father, I was excited and terrified in the same moment. Would I be a good dad? How would I take care of her, continue in seminary studies and as a student/pastor of the church? Would what I earned (\$14,000/ year + housing) be enough for all the needs of beginning a family? Once she was born, the questions of temporal provision paled in significance to those of my role as her dad.

All this sorrow, all this promise, all this pain. Such is life, such is being, such is spirit, such is love.

Today, we find ourselves in new and challenging times. Like so many times before, we desperately need positive connections in our world, our nation, our communities. We long for the ability to know each other and relate, to connect and be understood, to find meaning and common agreement. Our politics and understanding of community have become all too familiar examples of deep partisanship rather than opening points of discourse and building blocks for the establishment of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.'s "Beloved Community." All too often, our focus is on the sorrow and the pain, rather than the promise and our humanity of being; that which is lacking in our present world, rather than the spirit and love which are present as well.

This month, I welcome you to join me in a fresh look at what matters for us, that which gives us meaning and contentment, hope and life. In all we do, may we be moved and determined to share All This Joy as people whose faith matters, who feel and encourage grace, and make God's love real everyday, as we

Re-Opening Task Force Update

Early in January, with the recommendations from church staff, the Penn NE Conference UCC and the Re-Opening Task Force, the Consistory approved a "pause of in-person worship and activities" at St. John's. Due to the increases in the infection rates and hospitalizations in our areas of the Delta and Omicron variants of the COVID-19 virus, a two week "pause" with additional evaluation every two weeks was determined to be our best way forward in keeping our congregation and our community as safe as possible.

The Task Force met on January 18 to hear reports on our community status and make additional recommendations to the Consistory. Please watch for updates on our website, <u>stjohnsuccfullerton.org</u>, on our St. John's UCC, Fullerton Facebook page and by direct email message updates to the congregation. The current surge in infection and hospitalization rates can most effectively be reduced by our willingness to minimize social gatherings, abide by distancing guidelines, mask wearing and encourage vaccinations/ boosters for all those eligible and able to be vaccinated.

When appropriate, in person worship and other activities will resume and the Task Force will communicate familiar guidelines and practices for our safety in gathering to ease us back together. Until then, and even after, we invite all to participate online, to welcome family and friends to join us from wherever they may be across the country. Thank you for your continuing faith and cooperation in supporting our whole community.



February Music Notes

One of my favorite "newer" hymns is Lord, You Have Come to the Lakeshore. Written in 1979 by Cesareo Gabarain, it is one of the most popular hymns to emerge from the 1970s revival of religious songs in Spain. The text has been translated into nearly eighty languages.

Monsenor Cesareo Gabarain (1936-1991), the Spanish composer-author, began his musical studies at age ten and was ordained to the priesthood in 1959. In addition to his theological education, Gabarain studied journalism and musicology.

Pescador de Hombres (Fisher of Men), is his most popular of the four hymns in the United Methodist Hymnal. Gabarain captures the total obedience of disciples and their willingness to give up everything:

"As Jesus was walking beside the Sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon called Peter and his brother Andrew. They were casting a net into the lake, for they were fishermen. 'Come, follow, me,' Jesus said, 'and I will send you out to fish for people.' At once they left their nets and followed him."

~Matthew 4:18-20, NIV

The hymn earnestly asks us to follow Christ with the same obedience and commitment. The refrain is a call to surrender to Jesus in response to his command to follow him. The gentle melody, PESCADOR DE HOMBRES, is reminiscent of a rocking boat by the lakeshore.

An interesting fact, this hymn was used in the 1993 movie Alive, based on a book about the survivors of the Andes plane crash in 1972, and the Spanish film Camino (2008), about a girl who died of spinal cancer in 1985.

Nancy Eichman Honored and Memorialized

Several years ago, St. John's established an Endowment, the funding for which comes from dedicated donations to the church. The investment account for these gifts has grown to over \$500.000 and adds more than \$20,000 annually to support our budget.

This account is symbolized by the Legacy Tree hanging on the wall behind the church parlor. All contributions to our Endowment are recognized by a leaf noting those who are honored or memorialized.

Recently, St John's received a very generous gift of \$21,000 in memory Nancy Eichman. Of that amount, \$20,000 will be added to



the Endowment Account and \$1,000 will be applied to the purchase of chairs for the pavilion.

Ron and his children, Christine, Timothy, Jeffrey, are honored to present this gift in memory and honor of Nancy, a beloved wife, mother, grandmother, and great grandmother. Nancy was 75 ½ when she passed into the arms of God. Nancy and Ron were married for 56 ½ years and spent 60 years of their lives together.

Nancy was a 43-year member of St. John's and for many years she led and coordinated the work as a past president of the Ladies Aid / Kitchen Crew. In addition to the many hours, she spent in the kitchen, she also sang in both the Jubilation and Chancel Choirs.

Her team of volunteers spent countless hours in the kitchen and prepared many meals for church events. The income from these efforts and her leadership contributed thousands of dollars to the church as these gifts provided many things for which there was never enough money in the church budget.

Nancy was a shining example of selfless dedication. St. John's will continue to benefit from her efforts.

Tornadoes in Kentucky and Wildfires in Colorado How You Can Help...

Standard-size band-aids

Our goal is to provide 20 kits. You can help by donating the following needed items:

- Hand towel approximately 15"x28" to 16"x32" (no fingertip, bath, dish towel or micro-fiber)
- Wash cloth
- Wide-tooth (only) comb
- Fingernail or toenail clipper

There will be a Drive-By Event scheduled for Saturday, February 19, from 10:00 a.m. to 12;00 Noon in the Grape St. Parking Lot. (snowdate February 26). If we are back in church for in-person worship, you will also find a large basket in the coat room area by the sanctuary to place your items. Deadline to receive items is Sunday, February 27.

Whitehall Food Pantry

St. John's will be running a bus to Sight and Sound Theater in Lancaster to view its new production "David".


