

Alan's PET scan shows that his last chemo had no effect on his cancer. In fact the tumors have grown. He had an MRI of the spine on Tuesday. This showed that the tumor on his spine that was radiated in February, has started to grow into the spinal cord. So far no symptoms of tingling or numbness in his legs or feet. Today, Alan has decided to start another round of chemo. He will receive Cytoxin and Adriamycin every 3 weeks for 3

rounds. He will then have a PET scan. Alan has decided that if there is no change in the tumors, he will not continue chemo. Please keep him and our family in your prayers during this difficult time.

# UCC National Headquarters Gets a New Home

The United Church of Christ no longer owns property in downtown Cleveland. The sale of the 700 Prospect Ave. building was officially completed on May 31. The purchase price was \$4.5 million. The sale ends a years-long process with the closure of the building in 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic and the uptick in remote and hybrid work. According to UCC's General Minister and President John Dorhauer, the proceeds from the sale-after some final expenses—will be added to the national setting's unrestricted endowment to help fund the mission of the UCC. He said, "As we look to position our organization for future success, we seek to invest more resources in mission and personnel and fewer resources in property. 700 Prospect has been a very good asset for us for over 30 years, but new technologies allow us to work differently in less space." The UCC bought the building for \$5.2 million from the Ohio Bell Telephone Co. in 1989. Current plans are for the building to be converted to apartments and retail space.

In the meantime, the church is making final preparations to move into leased space in another downtown building a half-mile away on the 11th floor at 1300 E. Ninth St., Suite 1100, Cleveland, OH 44114. The build-out offices there awaits city inspection and once that is complete and an occupancy permit issued, the move-in can begin and, hopefully, be completed by the end of July. #### **Ukraine Relief Fund Update**

We will continue to receive donations to the Ukraine Relief Fund as the need is ongoing. Offering envelopes can be found on the table in the lounge area by the sanctuary. You can send your check into the church office payable to St. John's or pay on-line or by text. Be sure to note "Ukraine Relief Fund" in the memo section or on the website link. Here are some ways your contributions have made a difference:

#### UCC National

"June 24 marked four months since the Russian military attacked Ukraine. The UCC is responding through ACT Alliance and its Global Ministries partners. During this time, ACT Alliance's partner, Hungarian Interchurch Aid, alone has reached more than 100,000 refugees and internally displaced people with humanitarian aid including food, medicine, shelter, transportation, and protection."

#### World Central Kitchen

"June 5 marked 100 days since Russia invaded Ukraine. With your support, WCK has built the largest food relief operation in Ukraine, reaching more than 290 cities and towns and distributed close to one million meals every single day. This wouldn't be possible without the 4,300 team members—cooking in restaurants, stocking warehouses, delivering meals, driving trucks—who work tirelessly to feed those in need, even while under attack themselves. Across Ukraine, WCK teams have distributed nearly 11 million pounds of food including flour, salt, pasta, oil, cheese, produce, canned meats, and more. WCK will continue this work in Ukraine as long as we are needed. Thank you for standing alongside us and the people of Ukraine to make it all possible."

#### Project HOPE

"Mental health services are overwhelmed in areas afflicted by conflict. Russia's devastating attacks on the Ukrainian people pose a challenge of providing appropriate psychosocial support that cannot be overstated. All Ukrainians, but healthcare workers in particular, have proven their strength and fortitude. But no person should be forced to suffer the atrocities that they are enduring. We must be conscious about the long-term effects of war and trauma on their mental health and emotional wellbeing. In addition to delivering shipments of medicines, medical supplies, and other support to health facilities in Ukraine, Project HOPE is collaborating with local partners that can provide counseling services. Experienced mental health leaders with clinical backgrounds, responsible for developing and implementing local programs, have been hired. We are planning to utilize online training tools to reach psychological first aid and help healthcare providers in the Ukraine crisis."

Yellow and blue lapel pins, made by our Crafters Group, are still available on the table in lounge area by the sanctuary.

# Lehigh Conference of Churches

It was recently announced that the Trexler Trust issued more than \$6 million in grants to several charities and organizations. The trust was established per Harry Trexler's will after he died in 1933 and when his wife died in 1934. Since then, Allentown and Lehigh County charities have benefited from more than \$178 million of grants in his name. Some of the largest awards this year were to Allentown—\$2.05 million—for its parks and to the Lehigh Conference of Churches—\$195,000—for support improvements to Dubbs Memorial Community Center (formerly Dubbs Memorial UCC).
