Showing Care and Support in COVID and Flu Season

We've hopefully all been paying attention to public health warnings of a more significant and severe flu season as well as anticipated COVID cases as the colder temperatures come and indoor activity and less mask wearing create increased exposure opportunities.

To do our part to help prevent a return to obligitory mask wearing, we are urged to get flu vaccinations and COVID boosters as soon as possible. With our increased group activities, we will monitor conditions related to the COVID pandemic and our responsible measures to promote health and care for all. We continue to have COVID exposures and breakthrough infections and are thankful people have taken measures to isolate, mask and return to activity when recuperated. This should be a reminder to us that the virus is still spreading around the globe, with still over 350 dying every day in the US according to the CDC. Please remember: our current vaccination, "boosting" and masking recommendations remain in effect and are posted on the website.

We urge all to use a mask during group singing, and give added attention if you are seated in close proximity to others.

For those vaccinated, masking is optional during other aspects of our worship and other gatherings. For those not vaccinated, we ask you to wear a mask. We provide KN-95 masks at our entry tables for all who would like one.

The Consistory continues to monitor case numbers and hospitalizations for COVID in our area and is paying attention to ongoing variants and projections for Fall/Winter 2022-23. We urge everyone who can to get vaccinated and "boosted," including children, to assist us in keeping our community and most vulnerable healthy. Thank you for your ongoing understanding and participation in these measures.

Music Corner of St. John's

My article this month is a Facebook post that was shared with me and after reading it, I couldn't help but share. Travis L. Boyd writes:

"Things have changed. There aren't as many people participating in church choirs these days. Some have gone on to sing in the heavenly choir. Some of the voices have weakened a bit. Some have lost a portion of their vocal range. The traditional ways of doing things are disappearing. Many choirs do not sing in robes anymore. The instrumentation has changed. The piano and organ are supplemented with other instruments, including drums and guitars. Things definitely have changed, and change is inevitable (and sometimes very healthy!)

However, choral singing is still beautiful. Dynamics are still breathtaking. Articulations and phrasing are still painting vivid pictures of the text. Good breath support is still creating notes that are on pitch and carry with them great depth of sound. Choir members are still dedicated to working hard each week to bless the Lord and His people.



PNEC News

Penn Northeast Conference (PNEC) current Conference Minister, Rev. Dr. Bonnie Bates, will be taking a well-deserved rest and renewal sabbatical in the first quarter of 2023 (Jan., Feb., Mar.). In preparation for her absence, the Staff & Personnel Committee at PNEC, along with Pastor Bonnie's guidance, and the Conference Board's approval have found a suitable candidate to fill Pastor Bonnie's role during this time. PNEC is pleased to announce that Rev. Dr. Becky Beckwith has accepted the position of Sabbatical Coverage Conference Minister. In major aspects of her coverage, PNEC will be looking to Becky as both a Pastoral and Spiritual leader who maintains a climate of pastoral care through guidance and support of authorized ministers and congregations. Pastor Becky will assume the supervisory role of PNEC paid and volunteer staff, facilitate all Church and Committee on Ministry functions of the Conference, and oversee the Search and Call process for full time calls as well as to be available to staff within the Conference for assistance. As her schedule permits, she will participate in programs and celebrations for authorized ministers and congregations in times of transition, crisis, and special needs.

Zion's Reformed UCC, Allentown's historic Liberty Bell Church and the oldest church in Allentown, had its final service on Sunday, October 2. Shrinking attendance on Sundays and financial concerns forced the church to cease services. The church is also home to the separate Liberty Bell Museum, which features a replica of the Liberty Bell and other exhibits from the Revolutionary War and colonial America. As one centuries-old era ends, a new one begins! The church is being passed on to Resurrected Life Community Church. The gifting of Zion's will allow Resurrected Life to expand the church's school programs, relocate its office spaces, explore using the sanctuary as a creative arts venue, and "continue its investment in the community.

Hurricane Disaster Relief

The United Church of Christ has issued an appeal to support immediate needs for families and communities affected by Hurricanes Ian and Fiona. With wind speeds topping out at 130 mph and 155 mph, respectively, Hurricanes Fiona and Ian have left devastation in their wake. More than a week and a half after Fiona's winds left Puerto Rico in the dark, hundreds of thousands of people remain without power. Hurricane Ian brought significant damage to Florida, Cuba, the Caribbean, and the Carolinas. Communities remain in crisis mode as the delivery of food, drinking water, and medical needs is challenged in hard-to-reach places cut off by downed trees, mudslides, and washed away bridges. It is way too early to know the full extent of damage in Florida, yet early indications point to a recovery that will take many years—perhaps a decade.

Your generous financial support will be used by the UCC and its global and local partners in the areas of greatest need. Your gift enables the church to be present with people amidst catastrophic and life-changing situations, offering immediate relief and providing longterm recovery support. Enclosed with this newsletter and in the lounge area at church is a special offering envelope marked "HURRICANE DISASTER RELIEF." You can send your check into the church office payable to St. John's or pay on-line or by text. Be sure to note "Hurricane Disaster Relief" in the memo section or on the website link.

Ukraine Relief Fund Update

Here are how your contributions have helped the people of Ukraine:

"After months of Russian occupation, the Ukrainian military liberated a large region near Kharkiv in September. WCK's Relief Team immediately jumped in to support communities that have been living under occupation, bringing fresh food and meal kits as soon as it was safe to do so. As Russian troops have withdrawn, the condition residents are living in is dire. Under occupation, food was being withheld from families, so WCK arrived as soon as possible to hope fill gaps as food systems recover. Missile strikes have left areas without power and no running water. Ukrainians throughout the region are readjusting to sleeping above ground after weeks and months of hiding in basements. As WCK brought in food, some people were afraid to speak with the WCK team—they couldn't believe support had finally arrived after such a dark time."

Whitehall Food Pantry

Donations are needed for Thanksgiving and Christmas holiday meals. We need boxes of stuffing or filling mix. Monetary donations will also be used to purchase gift certificates for turkeys. Other food items are always accepted as well. A shopping cart can be found in the coatroom area off the sanctuary where you can place your donations.


