We all make agreements in life, with family and spouses, with business colleagues, with neighbors and friends, even among political parties and nations. With the agreement comes an expectation, and understanding, either spoken or assumed what what will happen as a result of the agreements made. There's an outcome we have in mind. Sometimes the task comes to completion as anticipated. Sometimes we find the results completely different from what we first imagined and to which we agreed.

We also make agreements with ourselves, in our own mind about our future, what we will do and who we will become, what steps we will take in our journey. We tell ourselves, and sometimes we share our hopes for agreement with the universe. In his best selling book, The Four Agreements, don Miguel Ruiz reminds us that the agreements we make with ourselves have the power to transform how we experience and live in this experience of life.

My life changed dramatically in January 2011 as my time in ministry with the United Methodist Church came to an end. I found myself doing what was essential to live, support myself and my children to the best of my ability, and to begin to recreate my own understanding of who I am. The challenge of all these things, all these life traumas and transitions at once seemed overwhelming. A pastor and friend at my new faith home in Dallas led a class on The Four Agreements. Knowing a little of my circumstances, he suggested I join the class and handed me the book. Through these agreements, I changed what I told myself and how I engaged with others, and it has made all the difference over the last 10+ years.

- Be Impeccable with Your Word
- Don't Take Anything Personally
- Don't Make Assumptions
- Always Do Your Best

For those interested in joining me, I'll be introducing us to this book through a small group conversation this Fall. We'll explore each of The Four Agreements and share our journey, with all of our questions, "yeah, buts", hesitations and hopefulness. None of these are easy. Yet, they will change your life if you let them.

As we begin the summer season, I want to invite everyone get involved in at least one new way with your faith family. Make an agreement with yourself to worship regularly throughout the summer. Make an agreement to invite someone to worship with you. Make an agreement to stay after worship, to linger and share in fellowship and to learn some new names. Make an agreement to participate in something that blesses others, especially our children. Make an agreement to focus on joyful possibilities and potential first, rather than having several reasons for why something won't work. Make an agreement to seek understanding and the perspective of others, rather than your own objections and the reasons you disagree. Make an agreement to connect with another person, by phone or card or visit and let them know they matter to you. We all make agreements. How will you choose to transform your life and others?

May our journey of faith affirm our hope and celebrate who we can be in relationship and agreement with each other as we "Worship, Love and Serve ~ No Matter What!"

### **News from Lehigh Conference of Churches**

At the 2023 Annual Meeting of the Lehigh Conference of Churches on May 18, the following individuals were recognized:

Rev. Dr. Becky Beckwith was installed as Vice President on the LCC's Board of Directors. Congratulations to Pastor Becky.

Rev. Dr. Scott Brooks-Cope was thanked for his years of service as Secretary on the Board of Directors. Scott will retire on September 1 from Phoebe Ministries and move to Florida. He will be our guest preacher at St. John's on August 20.

From July 2022 to April 2023, the LCC (located at Dubbs Memorial Community Center) has served 57,019 meals, donated 110,453 lbs. of food, hosted 839 people at its drop-in center, secured 17 landlords to participate in its landlord engagement program, and was able to obtain gainful employment for 91% of their clients.

### Music at St. John's

This July, our theme for worship will be finding Christ through our senses. Through sight, touch, smell, taste and hearing, how do we find Christ in our daily lives?

During the month of July, we will begin using a beautiful hymn written by Mary Louise Bringle, published by GIA Publications, which only appears in four hymnals entitled "Christ Be in our Senses."

### **Worship Celebrations In July**

During the 5 Sundays of July, we will explore how we can experience God more deeply through our senses. Our July theme, Come to Your Senses: Developing Our Five Spiritual Senses, will guide us into the Gospel of John. Upon reading John's Gospel these last months, the prominence of the five senses becomes apparent in the text (see John 6:41-59, for example). Even though it may seem like our physical senses have little to do with our walk of faith, John helps us realize their crucial importance in knowing God well.

As you think about how you experience God in different ways, ask yourself...

Have I ever had such a bad cold that I couldn't smell or taste anything? (If any of you had COVID and lost your sense of taste or smell, you know.)

Have you ever gotten water in your ears so badly that the world around you sounded like a muffled mumble?

Have you ever fallen asleep on your arm and then, in the middle of the night, awakened to the terror that your hand has temporarily lost all ability to feel?

Our senses help us connect to our life experiences in powerful ways! Come and worship with others in the St. John's UCC, Fullerton family through the five Sundays of July as we experience God fully through the life God gives us in Christ.

### **Bus Trip to Ocean City, NJ**

Want to get away for a day at the beach and not worry about driving the distance? Want to enjoy great food on the boardwalk?

The "fun-raising" committee has just the trip for you. On Saturday, September 23, 2023, St. John's is running a bus trip to Ocean City, New Jersey for the day. The cost per person is \$42.00. Perkiomen Bus Tours is chartering the trip with a 52-passenger coach bus. The bus will pick up passengers in the parking lot of St. John's at 8:30am. We will arrive in Ocean City around 10:40-10:50am. We will be dropped off at 13th St and Boardwalk in Ocean City, NJ. The bus comes equipped with WI-FI and the ability to recharge your electronic devices at each seat. At the end of the day, we will be picked up at 7pm at the same location to head home.

After arriving, you will have the time to yourselves to go to the beach, walk the boardwalk, shop the many stores, play mini golf with all the courses being right on the boardwalk, munch down on great food at restaurants like Three Brothers Pizza or Manco Manco, or just enjoy enjoy the breeze and the sound of the waves sitting on the benches watching the people go by! Bring a folding chair or two if you like. Don't miss this great opportunity to end summer the best way possible!

Please see either Brian Strauss, Brian Fisher, Kenda Catalini or Carol Raszler in church to pay for the trip. Once paid, you will be placed on a sign-up sheet that will be in the back of church. Deadline for payment will be Sunday, August 13.

Here are some questions and answers that you may have about the OC, NJ day trip.

Q: Will the bus be accessible to bring back items all day?

A: The bus is typically not available throughout the day, since the bus driver is off duty during the time we are there. A time would need to be coordinated with the driver for it to be available. A possible time will be discussed at the time of the trip. At the designated time, it would be suggested to bring back your beach items or if you went shopping to drop off the items as well.

Q: Will all the stores be open on the boardwalk during the time we are there?

A: Many of the stores are opened on the boardwalk in September. It is dependent on the weather and staffing as some of the staff of most places are students. Stores are individually owned and owners try to stay open, especially weekends, through September. Based on prior years, there will be plenty open for shopping and food. With the NJeep Invasion happening on September 23, (Jeeps will be lined up on the boardwalk from noon-5pm) there will be a good chance that most shops will be open.

Q: Will beach tags need to be bought to go onto the beach?

A: After September 4, the need for beach tags ends. You may go onto the beach if you would like without having to purchase a beach tag. Water may be cold. Just beware!

Q: What are some great places to eat?

A: For pizza. there is Manco & Manco (2 locations), Three Brothers, and Preps Pizzeria. For seafood, there is Ike's Famous Crabcakes and Clancy's by the Sea. Other notable places are Blue Cactus Taco Shop, Chickie's & Pete's (2 locations) and a food court. For you sweet lovers there is Kohrs Ice Cream, TLC Polis Water Ice, Jilly's Candy Factory, Cinnabon, Johnsons Popcorn and Ben & Jerry's. There is something for everybody!

Q: What is there to do on the boardwalk?

A: Mini golf, Shops, Amusement park, Go carts, Escape Rooms (book online at ocescaperoom.com) and much more. You can get more information by going online to <u>oceancityvacation.com</u>


On a separate note, keep Saturday, December 2 open as well. We're looking at another bus trip, this time to New York City!

### What is OCWM?

Many people are uncertain or don't even know what OCWM is or does. People give to it; it appears as a line item on our church's offering envelopes; and is an option to give on our website or by text.

Our Church's Wider Mission (OCWM) is the name given to congregational gifts that support the wider UCC Ministry in associations, in conferences, and in the national and global church. It is divided into "Basic Support" and "4 Special Mission Offerings." If a church contributes to all five separate funds, like St. John's does, it is designated as "5 for 5" church.

OCWM's "Basic Support" provides funding from congregations for Conferences (like our own Penn Northeast Conference) and the national ministries of the United Church of Christ (Wider Church Ministries, Local Church Ministries, Justice and Witness Ministries, General Ministries, and Pension Boards).

OCWM's "Special Mission Offerings" is composed of four offerings that sponsor vital ministries that bring hope to people in the U.S. and around the world. These offerings include: Neighbors in Need (NIN), One Great Hour of Sharing (OGHS), The Christmas Fund, and Strengthen the Church.

# **POWER**

It was my friend and colleague Pastor Becky who invited me to a rally of faith leaders June 2020, in the wake of George Floyd's murder. Standing there in front of Zion Reformed UCC on Hamilton Street in Allentown, I made the commitment to join POWER Interfaith. I do this work to honor the memory of my father, the Rev. George H. Yoder, a passionate advocate for justice, and I do this work to help build a better world for our grandchildren, Hazel and Casper.

On June 6 and 7, I was in Harrisburg for a statewide meeting of POWER Interfaith. As we began, I was sitting at a table with two Christian pastors, a rabbi, and a follower of Islam; each of us, compelled by our faith to work for racial and economic justice on a livable planet.

As a Christian, I ground my commitment to this work in Jesus' mission statement: "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim release to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to set free those who are oppressed." -Luke 4:18

On June 7, POWER members from Lancaster to Philadelphia to the Lehigh Valley, met with our respective legislators to encourage them to advocate for budget allocations that will improve the lives of poor and oppressed Pennsylvanians: fair funding for public education, an increase in Pennsylvania's minimum wage of \$7.25, and allocations to help families winterize their homes.

All of those issues, inadequate education, low wages, and substandard housing contribute to the hunger and homelessness we are seeing right here in Whitehall. We, as a congregation respond to those needs by supporting the Whitehall Food Pantry and supplying the children in our school district with necessary supplies. I am so proud of our mission outreach.

Ultimately the work of POWER begins in congregations with people of faith looking to work together with others to change conditions impacting their communities.

This old hymn reminds us of the blessing we share with each other as we lift our prayers to God for one another. For over 15 years, prior to our COVID experience, knitters and sewers in the St. John's family helped make prayer shawls, prayer squares, or prayer lap blankets as signs of our care and support for those in the hospital, facing cancer, or some other significant health issue. The ministers would take these gifts of support and love to persons in the congregation and remind them of the prayers of the congregation offered during worship.



These symbols became powerful reminders of our connection to God and each other. Some families have returned the prayer items at some point in their faith journey or at a loved one's passing, so the shawl or lap blanket could be washed and shared again

with someone in need. Rev. Don Dech, a former Visitation Pastor, made the wood ladder for the shawls that is in the Elevator Foyer / Coat Room entrance of the sanctuary.

In recent years, our knitting crew has dwindled to 2-3 who help keep this ministry going. ### **General Disaster Relief Fund**

Contributions received in July will go toward UCC National for "Ukraine Disaster Relief." The explosion and collapse of the Kakhovka hydroelectric dam in southern Ukraine was one of the biggest industrial and ecological disasters in Europe in decades. This event happened at 2am on June 6, as a deluge of water burst through the dam that had previously held back water the size of the Great Salt Lake in Utah. This catastrophe destroyed entire villages; forced thousands of people downstream; flooded farmlands; deprived tens of thousands of people of power and clean water; caused massive environmental damage; and left irrigation systems without a source of water. Donations to help can be placed in the offering plate, mailed to the church office, or by on-line and text giving. Be sure to designate "Ukraine Disaster Relief" in the memo section. You can also find General Disaster Relief envelopes on the table in the lounge area.



When you receive this newsletter, we are still collecting donations until the end of June that will go towards Project HOPE to help replace medical supplies and generators destroyed by Russian missile attacks in Ukraine. There is also an urgent need for water. A recent communication we received from Project HOPE said: "Since the start of the full-scale invasion of Ukraine, millions of Ukrainians have had limited access to clean drinking water. The Russian military has

attacked water supply and sanitation facilities; power outages have led to water cuts; and reconstruction has been complicated by the need for generators, pipe fittings, and water treatment systems. The Russian military has continued to damage the electricity pylons and electrical power stations. As a result, some villages have been without power and without access to centralized water supplies. Project HOPE began working in these regions to supply emergency drinking water. For the last five months, the team has delivered roughly 800,000 gallons of drinking water to the communities in need."

### **Other Outreaches**

We will continue to receive donations for Strengthen the Church until the end of June. This is a special mission offering of UCC National which supports the expansion of ministry and growth of local UCC congregations. Your generosity will plant seeds for new churches, awaken new ideas in existing churches, and develop the spiritual life in our youth and young adults.

We received word on the final tally for the Shoe Drive at Frieden's UCC in Oley, Pa. A total of 226 bags or about 5,650 shoes were collected. The truck came on June 10 to Frieden's to pick up all the shoes. Frieden's was informed that it was the top collector of shoes in the northeast region. We are happy that St. John's was the church with the largest collection of shoes given to Frieden's—465 pairs of shoes or 22 trash bags.

Thank you to everyone who contributed towards "Tornado Relief" in May," A check for \$555.00 has been sent to UCC Disaster Ministries.
