The Work of Christmas in the New Year

Come Alive in 2024!

This newsletter arrives in the hustle and bustle and fevered frenzy of the holidays. While we are in final preparations for Christmas, time with people we love and people we tolerate, we may feel the added stress of unmet expectations. The day after Christmas can be a letdown. For weeks, sometimes months in advance, we prepare for the coming of this single day. We make our Christmas lists, gather lists from others, go shopping for gifts, put up decorations, listen to seasonal music, plan elaborate meals, light candles on the Advent wreath and then the day comes and goes in 24 hours just like any other day.

Then what? All of that build-up for a brief few moments that swiftly join the stream of history leave us with a sense of both fatigue and bewilderment. What comes next?



Christian theologian and teacher, pastor and mystic, Rev. Dr. Howard Thurman, viewed the days after Christmas from a spiritual perspective. He wrote a poem, "The Work of Christmas Begins," to express his sentiments. Properly understood, our work is only just beginning after Christmas.

Followers of Christ have been commissioned to walk the path he did. To bind up the broken-hearted. To preach good

news to the poor. To proclaim liberty to the captives.

Christmas brings the incarnate God, the Prince of Peace, to humanity. In this prince's kingdom mercy, justice, and love reign. As citizens of this heavenly kingdom and members of this royal household, Christ's followers serve as ambassadors of this kingdom ethic. Now the day after Christmas, our work is only just beginning.

From The Mood of Christmas and Other Celebrations by Howard Thurman

When the song of the angels is stilled, when the star in the sky is gone, when the kings and princes are home, when the shepherds are back with their flocks, the work of Christmas begins: to find the lost,

to heal the broken,
to feed the hungry,
to release the prisoner,
to rebuild the nations,
to bring peace among the people,
to make music in the heart.

A visitor seeking advice from the Rev. Howard Thurman one day was talking about what the world needs when Thurman interrupted him. "Don't ask what the world needs, ask what makes you come alive, and go do it,"

And then go and do that. Because what

Thurman told him. "Because what the world needs are people who have come alive." Thurman's response went viral before the term "viral" was invented.

Ciited by countless inspirational speakers, even cultural icon Oprah Winfrey, his quote has become an internet meme. But what makes those words stick is that Thurman validated them by the way he lived.

Thurman forged a connection between Mohandas Gandhi and the Rev. Martin Luther King Jr. that gave

wings to the civil rights movement. He wrote a bombshell of a book that revolutionized the traditional portrait of Jesus. His teachings inspire leaders as diverse as civil rights icon John Lewis, the Democratic congressman from Atlanta, and Barbara Brown Taylor, a celebrated author and speaker.

He was the first pastor to co-found an intentionally multiracial and multifaith church in the United States; the first African-American pastor to travel to India and meet Gandhi, singing a Negro spiritual with Gandhi. And he was one of the first pastors to inspire King to merge Gandhi's philosophy of nonviolent resistance with the civil rights movement. Taking to heart the teaching of Jesus, Thurman sought to inspire people and build relationships, challenging us to be fully alive and do the work of transformation. It will not be easy, however, it will change the world.

As 2024 begins, may this added epiphany from Rev. Dr. Thurman invite us to fulfill the work of Christmas every day of the year as those who "Worship, Love and Serve ~ No Matter What!"

To each of us, in 2024, may we experience God's love, trust in the grace of Jesus Christ, and live in the hope of the Holy Spirit. Happy New Year, friends!

Better Than Uber! Transportation Connection

Part of the "Strategic Plan" that was developed prior to COVID, not yet implemented, was to provide connections for people who are no longer able to come to worship simply because they no longer drive. Their only St. John's Connection comes through home visits or hospital calls, cards and phone calls, or on the rare occasion where a family member or friend will bring them to worship with us. Pavilion Pledge Drive

Three years ago, we undertook a capital campaign—this one to develop our "Field of Dreams". This campaign officially ends at the end of 2023, and St. John's is grateful for the many pledges and gifts.

This was actually the second of two campaigns that saw many improvements to our church properties, including construction of a beautiful pavilion, re-paving of the original parking lot, construction of a new Fox Hall Bathroom, Field of Dreams paving with landscaping/lighting, and a loan to ourselves to upgrade our heating system. Additionally, there were significant township and engineering fees.

Total expenses for these projects amounted to \$660,000. Most of the funding came from our two Capital Campaigns with the balance obtained from a mortgage—which has a current balance of about \$83,900.

Since constructed, the pavilion has been used for many outdoor events. To fund the development of the Field of Dreams, we initiated this second, three-year capital campaign. More than 80 pledges were received, totaling \$52,000. Only 7 pledges were not fulfilled (totaling \$3035.00), as life conditions change. There also were many donations from people who did not pledge.

Our challenge is to continue to support reducing the mortgage even though the campaign will have officially ended. All gifts, large or small, are appreciated. There is a line on your weekly Church envelope for "Pavilion Loan", which we hope you will consider using.

Without you, the loyal members of St. John's, there would be no Pavilion and we would be without many other improvements. Thank you for helping to fulfill the vision of many years ago.

2024 Budget Approved

At the Fall Congregational Meeting held on Sunday, Nov. 12 during the morning worship service, the congregation voted to approved the 2024 Budget. Our sincere thanks to Sue Weldner, Treasurer, and the Stewardship and Finance Committee members for the information shared and the observations about how God continues to grow our capacity post COVID. Copies of approved budget are available upon request to the Church Office.

Sue Weldner shared the following highlights for 2024 over 2023:

- 4% overall increase in income in projected
- 4% increase in weekly offerings
- 5% increase in fundraising events income (Coming back to pre-pandemic levels)
- 4% overall increase in expenses
- 2% salary increases; health insurance increase est. at 5%
- \$16k "excess" revenue is projected (While we are working toward ability to grow additional staff positions, we are not there yet.)

Elevator Update

Can We Give You a Extra Arm of Support?

We often don't realize how important something is to our function and support, until it is not available. We will be able to repair and restore access with our elevator to Fox Hall and the Sanctuary / Main level from the Grape Street entrance! That's the good news! The not so good news is that parts are on back order and being sought out for the needed work. Our current best estimate is to have service restored in mid-January if all goes well. Additionally, the cost of the repairs will be just over \$41,000.

The Property Committee and the Stewardship and Finance Committee and Consistory are all ready to explore options for how to meet this need. We anticipate that our property insurance will cover some of the cost of repairs. That's good news! We have some funds held in reserve for "rainy days" and "emergencies." That's good news! We have options begin raising funds to meet the challenge. That's good news! We already have one contribution designated to elevator repairs, and we welcome additional gifts toward the repair needs to help offset whatever insurance doesn't cover.

AND... with our elevator inoperable for the time being, some have not been able to come to worship on site since mid October. That's not good. So, here's how you can help!

We're seeking volunteers for Sunday mornings at our Grape Street entry to assist those needing extra support, such as carrying walkers or offering a steady arm to navigate the steps. Pastor Steve

encourages anyone able to lend a hand to contact the Church Office. This effort is vital to ensure that "ALL ARE WELCOME" truly includes everyone, especially while our elevator is under repair. Your help can make a significant difference in enabling everyone to participate in worship.

Kim Hillegass and Tyler Shankweiler attended the Fall Meeting of congregations of the Penn NE Conference UCC, November 4, along with Pastor Steve, Becky Beckwith and Becca Stephens in their capacity. Tyler was the ONLY YOUTH out of all churches to attend.

What can we do to connect with our youth? We want to invite our past 3 years of Confirmation classes, including our current year confirmands, to some sort of youth events in 2024, for food, fun and connection on a quarterly basis, and hopefully move to monthly events. 
SOPPER BET WILL BET W

Did you know that St. John's receives 1% back on your Redner's grocery receipts? It's a simple way to support St. John's fundraising efforts. The entire receipt must be submitted, and it must say "Save-A-Tape on it. If you use a charge card and do not want any numbers to show on the receipt, you can black them out.
