We Are Witnesses! - Digital Discipleship

The global pandemic taught us that we can do much more than we initially thought as a faith-sharing community. We found new ways to worship together through digital means like Zoom. While it wasn't the same as meeting in person, it allowed us to stay connected. We discovered the power of sharing our faith stories and images online to uplift and strengthen our community.

The primary goal of our church is discipleship—helping people follow Jesus's life and teachings, embodying acts of compassion and love, and guiding each other in Christ-like behavior. As Jesus commanded, "Go and make disciples of all nations" (Matthew 28:19), we understand that simply opening our doors isn't enough. We actively seek ways to invite people into our community of love and grace through diverse activities and experiences.

However, with digital natives like Generation Z and Millennials, their lives largely revolve around technology and digital interactions. Rather than expecting these younger generations to follow old patterns, we need to become more accessible online, where they are most active.

These younger generations prefer digital discipleship through bite-sized content on platforms like YouTube, TikTok, Twitch, Instagram, Snapchat, and Twitter. Remember the days of MySpace and Facebook? Today, these platforms are less popular among the youth, who opt for newer digital spaces, highlighting a generational shift in media consumption.

In this era, to communicate effectively, we must use the platforms that newer generations use to truly "speak their language." The Day of Pentecost story illustrates this beautifully, as people of many nationalities and dialects gathered in Jerusalem, and through the Holy Spirit, everyone could understand each other despite their different languages (Acts 2:7-8).

Today, digital disciples might engage with a faith message through a single image, a few words, or none at all. They connect daily or weekly through posts rather than traditional sermons or classes. This generation responds to visuals that they can share, spreading inspiration and prompting action, embodying the essence of "liking" and "sharing" as part of their discipleship.

They send prayer requests via texts, share photos, check-in online for worship, and post about their meaningful connections and experiences. These moments—humorous, serious, or poignant—are where life and faith intersect, forming what we can call "God moments."

While in-person gatherings remain important, today's digital disciples are not restricted to physical spaces. They make intentional efforts to guide their online communities to larger, meaningful engagements, creating a community of faith that impacts lives and deepens relationships. This online presence allows them to connect with others who share similar desires for meaningful experiences in an increasingly isolating world.

Discipleship is fundamentally about modeling a life of love as Christ's followers. The love of God compels us to create spaces and experiences that are open and welcoming. Instead of dwelling on the difficulties of understanding this new generation, we should focus on how we can better share our stories and learn to make new connections. Speaking in a faith language that resonates with them is crucial for them to hear, understand, and embrace our message.

This Easter season reminds us of our role as witnesses to God's love through Jesus Christ, leading us to the experience of Pentecost where the Spirit breathes life into creating a new, transformative

community. I'm a witness! You are a witness! We are witnesses, now and always, as we "Worship, Love and Serve ~ No Matter What!"




Social Hour Demonstration by Michael Thomas

General Disaster Relief Fund

Food is essential to life every single day, all over the world, and it is more important than ever in a crisis. Not only is a freshly prepared meal one less thing someone has to worry about in the wake of a disaster, it is a reminder that you are not alone, someone is thinking about you, and someone cares. Food has the power to be the nourishment and hope people need to pick themselves back up in the darkest times.

For chef and restauranteur Jose Andres, the food crisis in Haiti after the earthquake in 2010, led to his establishing the World Central Kitchen. Since then, WCK has responded to disasters across the globe by addressing the urgent need to feed people whose lives have been shattered by hurricanes, earthquakes, volcano eruptions, wildfires, floods, and wars. On April 1 six foreign workers from WCK and a Palestinian driver were killed by an airstrike in the Gaza strip. They had just unloaded 100 tons of food at a warehouse and were heading out in a car branded with the organization's logo and two armored vehicles. While just over 1200 miles away in the Ukraine, WCK has served more than 260 million meals to Ukrainians and refugees since the initial attack there by Moscow in February of 2022.

We will continue to receive donations for Disaster Relief in both Ukraine and Gaza. You will find special offering envelopes on the table in the lounge. Contributions may be placed in the offering plate, mailed to the church office, or given online or by text.
