BRAD'S CONNECTIONS

Last year I quoted Max De Pree, retired CEO of Herman Miller, a premier business office furniture maker when he told the story of an employee who was promoted into management position. The new manager stated, "Now I have 200 people reporting to me." He was corrected and told that he now works for 200 people.

You have elected me as Lt Governor. We have 15 clubs in our Division and 450 members. I am here to serve you. I have been asked, "What will be my Legacy during 2013-2014?" So in turn I have to ask you what will be *your* Legacy in the coming year. What is your legacy to your club? To Kiwanis? To your Community?

This past year I Chaperoned the Key Leader Weekend, Outside of Santa Barbara and I was inspired by the 80 plus kids we all supported to make that weekend possible. (Talk about electricity!) There, they learned the philosophy of Servant Leadership - coined by Robert Greenleaf, founder of the Greenleaf Center for Servant Leadership. (According to Greenleaf...)

"The servant-leader is servant first... It begins with the natural feeling that one wants to serve, to serve *first*. Then conscious choice brings one to aspire to lead. That person is sharply different from one who is *leader* first, perhaps because of the need to assuage an unusual power drive or to acquire material possessions...

The leader-first and the servant-first are two extreme types. Between them there are shadings and blends that are part of the infinite variety of human nature."

"The difference manifests itself in the care taken by the <u>servant-first</u> to make sure that other people's highest priority needs are being served.

The best test, and difficult to administer, is: Do those served grow as persons? Do they, while being served, become healthier, wiser, freer, more autonomous, more likely themselves to become servants?

These young adults learned at this weekend that:

Individuals can make a difference.

Individuals working together can make change from within.

By reframing their views and actions within the servant leadership context, they and those they work with can begin or continue to create a positive, serving culture.

Isn't that a Legacy we all want to leave? A positive Serving culture to communities we serve, to the children we serve, to the seniors we serve, and to the members we serve.

I am sharing this with you because I feel Servant Leadership is how we will make those positive connections in our communities. It is how we will grow.

We will grow as a division when those we serve grow as persons.

We will develop leaders when those being served, become healthier, wiser, freer, more autonomous, more likely themselves to become servants.

I hope as Lt Governor those Presidents that I serve grow as persons.

I hope those clubs I serve become Healthier and grow in strength, fellowship and in members.

I hope the members you serve are more likely to serve and Step Up to be leaders in their club, in their division, in their district.

Our Governor, Rae Whitby-Brummer, has adopted the theme of Super Heroes this year. In turn my theme this year is "Connecting the Super Heroes next door." We will remind the communities we serve what Super Heroes (Kiwanians) are. We will keep our eyes open for the Super Heroes next door that need to fly with us. Your neighbor might be a Super Hero of Service – waiting to be invited to your next meeting.
