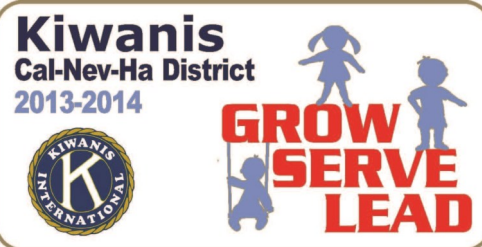

Members served hamburgers, hot dogs, veggie burgers, cole slaw, chips and drinks to approximately 150 participants, family members and volunteers associated with the Trailfest event. This is the Club's sixth year cooking for this event and the first time the Club donated the food as well as our culinary skills.

The Ride-On organization provides therapeutic riding experiences to the disabled at two locations – Thousand oaks and Chatsworth. Adaptive or therapeutic riding is a unique combination of sport, recreation and education.



Specially trained and highly qualified instructors use their knowledge of disabilities to teach horsemanship skills to riders with varying ability levels. A typical lesson involves safety on and around horses, warm up exercises, games and riding skills including equitation and obstacle. Increased strength, balance and self-esteem are some of the benefits of this wonderful recreational activity.

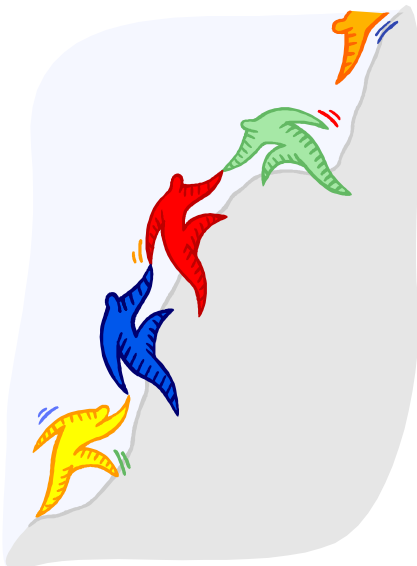
Held at the scenic Paramount Ranch in the Santa Monica Mountains, Trailfest allows riders with disabilities to expand their riding beyond the training arenas and onto trails within the beautiful Santa Monica Mountains. The riders raise money for Ride-On through sponsorships, and Kiwanis makes Ride-On "bigger" and more successful by taking responsibility for a major component of the fund-raiser. Trailfest is one of the Thousand Oaks Club's most rewarding service projects.
