Congratulations goes out to **Betty Stapleford** as the winner of our first Zeller Fellowship. We have started the grid for our next presentation. Our goal is to have the grid filled and the presentation made in time for the Division Installation. Please talk to all your members and friends and let's "git her done".

About a month ago I went to a refresher course for the MNT program. I picked up a lot of information.

1) If you, a member of your club, your club itself or a member of the community would like to join the Zeller Fellowship family, then there is a new way to make it possible. For a donation of \$50.00 per month for 25 months you too may become a Zeller Fellow.

2) The MNT program is geared for five years and is set to end in 2015. Kiwanis International has several participation levels that individuals and clubs may achieve. Some of these levels are set up to be achieved over the five years of the program. The good news is that the five years begins when you and/or your club decide to get involved. That means if you or your club wished to become a 100K club you still can do it over the next 5 years. The goal of a Model Club is an average of \$750.00 per member. This too works out to only \$150.00 per year per member.

Even when 2015 comes around the program, like IDD, will continue to accept contributions and move into those areas of the world that still need assistance. Your pledge is, initially, all that is needed to help Kiwanis reach and exceed the goal of \$110 million by 2015.

Lastly, I would like to remind all of you that it only takes \$1.80 to provide 3 doses of the tetanus vaccine to protect a mother and all her future children. Our goal can only be achieved with your contributions. Please don't wait to send in your club's contributions. Sent in the money monthly. Think of it as your club's monthly report for the MNT program.

Remember every \$18.00 saves 10 mothers and countless children. Our goal as Kiwanians, is "....dedicated to changing the world, **one child** and one community at a time.
