#### Governor's Visit 2020

On August 22, Division 42 hosted the 2020 visit of Kiwanis Cal-Nev-Ha District Governor Tim Cunning. There were 56 in attendance at the Moorpark Country Club, where a good time and a fine meal was had by all.

In addition to hearing from the Governor, we (1) de-installed the current Lieutenant Governor (that's me!), installed the new Lieutenant Governor (Debbie Heaslip of the Santa Susana Club), and installed the new Lieutenant Governor Elect, Matt Moore of the Santa Barbara Club. All of the changes take effect on October 1, 2020, for the 2020-2021 Kiwanis year.

We were honored to have as guests the newly-elected CNH District Governor, Gary Gray, and his wife Marcia, as well as the new District Governor Elect, Margot Dutton.

Our Master of Ceremonies was Tony Antonelli, former Lieutenant Governor and current Children's Fund Ambassador to Division 42.

It was explained to me years ago that Lieutenant Governors and Governors are the royalty of Kiwanis. That being the case, this was indeed a regal event.

The ancient Chinese had a mild curse which applies here: "May you live in interesting times." Classical Chinese society was very well-mannered and formal, and innovation and disorganization was to be discouraged and feared.

In some ways, Kiwanis had until recently developed the same routine – our weekly meetings, our monthly DCM's, midyears and annual conventions – were socially pleasant but not urgent or exciting or illuminating. We did what we did the way we did because we'd always done it that way.

All of that was dramatically changed by the Covid-19 crisis. So many of the things that we love about Kiwanis - the socializing, the close work with community leaders, children, and other volunteer groups - were suddenly not just unwise, but illegal!

We were suddenly living in VERY interesting times. Deprived of our mobility, we were forced to adopt electronics. We entered cautiously into new relationships through ZOOM, and most of us are now comfortable with it. Some of us love it. It was a change we would not have made without Covid – but we will reap the benefits of that change for years to come in the form of more flexible club and committee meetings and schedules, better public relations, and more widespread recruitment.

Clubs in the division have conducted virtual service projects and virtual fundraisers – I believe T.O. has scheduled an online version of its annual "Brewfest." The Simi Club is sponsoring a city-wide parade of food donations for the homeless and those affected by Covid. Other clubs are re-inventing their signature Projects to fit the post-Covid world.

We've had hundreds of Zoom regular meetings, and if they aren't quite as social as what we were used to, we were surprised at how interesting our fellow members were when we listened to them.

Clubs are trading notes and contacts regarding home-based projects, and are providing delivery services for others responding to the Covid threat.

I have been amazed and pleased with the stick-to-it-iveness demonstrated by our clubs and our SLP's.

When this is over – and it will be over some day – we'll all be delighted to meet and work in the open, without masks and without electronics. But we'll all – each and every club - know how to organize and conduct an online meeting or online workshop, how to recruit volunteers on Facebook, and how to better meet the teched-up needs of the children that are our responsibility.

Interesting – and ultimately rewarding – times indeed!



Our club received approval of a \$600 Cal-Nev-Ha COVID-19 Community Assistance Grant to match \$600 from our Foundation. The Safe Passage gang-diversion program used the funds to provide scholarships for 40 kids. They were divided into six groups and rotated through recreational activities that taught 6-foot distancing and the importance of hand-washing in protecting themselves and their families from COVID-19. Just for fun, they had archery, pool noodles and a giant sling shot; everything was constantly sanitized. (The faces of the kids are re-touched to preserve confidentiality.) When we visited the program on August 5, we got to hold up the thank-you banner that the kids had made for us and had signed.



We joined the Newbury Park High School Key Club in collecting donations of milk, eggs and canned and packaged foods for distribution to needy families by Adelante Comunidad Conejo. Every Thursday, Betty and Tom Stapleford welcome the donations at their home, then take them to the United Methodist Church of Thousand Oaks on East Janss Road. The organization began with a desire to address concerns within the Valley's Spanish-speaking community regarding opportunities and services offered to their children in the local public schools.


Moorpark Kiwanians organized, collected and delivered school supplies to the Moorpark Pantry Plus for students who need a helping hand.


For the month of July, Oxnard Kiwanis presented 3 scholarships to college-bound Key Club members. Each scholarship was for \$500. 00. Recipients were:




# Simi Valley
