As we did last year, we adopted a BumbleBee family who live in Woodland Hills. Their 3-year-old girl is being treated at UCLA Medical Center. We wrapped presents for her and her 5-year-old brother at our meeting on December 10 and delivered them to the family on December 13. The BumbleBee Foundation offers hope and provides support to the overall well-being of pediatric cancer families.

Kiyimba Yosef, the President of the Kiwanis Club of Kampala, Uganda, visited us on December 10. His club was chartered in 2015, one of the 3 Kiwanis clubs in Uganda. It has about 45 members, 25 to 30 of whom attend meetings at any one time. He said that every meeting MUST start with a joke and that many of the meetings are purely social get-togethers. He said that there are 15 schools in his district and



that 30% of the girls there are not in school, primarily because they have entered puberty and do not have access or funds for feminine hygiene items and do not want to risk embarrassment. His club's Signature Project is to provide those supplies so that girls can remain in school. Much of the funding to support the 2000 girls that they work with is provided by the club's members. We supported their efforts with a \$100 donation from our Foundation.











On December 15, we held our holiday party at the home of Paul and Marty Campbell, featuring a turkey dinner with all the trimmings, luscious desserts, a gift swap, and lots of stories, laughs, and Kiwanis love.
