
Conejo Valley


A total of about 6500 letters from all local Kiwanis groups were turned in on the afternoon of December 7 at Macy's Believe Day. This means over \$13,000 was



Simi Vatley

Robert "Bob" Earle Pegg was bom September 20, 1925 in Kalamazoo, Michigan and died on July 2, 1994 at the age of 68. During his lifetime, he did many things for his country; for the City of Simi Valley and the surrounding area; and for Kiwanis International Division 42, and the Kiwanis Club of Simi Valley. Our dub wishes to recognize him as our "Heart of a Hero" because of his many contributions and wide-ranging acts on Kiwanis and our community. Although he is no longer with us, his memory lives on.

Military Service


Bob served in the Navy from 1943 to 1966 and was discharged with the rank of Chief Yeoman. The administrative and recordkeeping skills he leamed in this role were used many times in his future endeavors. At the age of 17, he was selected to be put ashore on Normandy Beach on the evening prior to the D-Day Invasion Since he knew Morse code from his Boy Scout days, his job was to scout the area and signal with a flashlight to the waiting task force to tell them where it was safe to come ashore. He landed with a team of less than 20 soldiers and, as far as he knew, he was the only survivor of that group because he never Saw any of his comrades again.

Contributions to Simi Valley - Resident since 1968

- One ofthe first Presidents of the Simi Valley Chamber of Commerce. This position eventually became known as the Chamber CEO. In this role, Bob was on the Moorpark College Simi Valley Community Advisory Committee which oversaw the first two years of the Simi Valley Consumer Fair. As planned, the sponsorship and leadership of the Fair was then tumed over to the Chamber of Commerce while Bob was President. This Fair has been a very popular and valuable community event and, after several name and location changes is now the very success Simi Valley Street Fair.
- One of the original founders of the Bank of Simi Valley which has changed hands over the years to become the current Union Bank.
- Served on the boards of numerous service clubs, induding the Elks Club of Simi Valley and a chapter of the Salvation Army and helped establish the Free Clinic of Simi Valley which is still very active today.
- Was a distinguished President of the Kiwanis Club of Simi Valley from 1979 to 1980 and a distinguished Lt.Governor O fDivision 42 from 1983 - 1984. He helped start the Moorpark Kiwanis Club and the first Circle K Club at Moorpark Community College. In recognition of his many community contributions, he was selected to serve as the Grand Marshall of the Simi Valley Days Parade during one of the years when Simi Valley Kiwanis actively ran this event.
- According to a past Simi Valley Mayor, Greg Stratton, Bob "had this amazing ability to stand there and talk to you, and when you came away fromom him, you realized you'd just volunteered to do something for some good group or organization". For this reason, he was often referred to as "Mr. Volunteer"
- Served with distinction as a member and foreperson of the Ventura County Grand Jury which is a volunteer
- position that entails many hours a week and is a year-long commitment.
- Ran twice for elected office a Seat On the Simi Valley School Board and a position on the Ventura County
- Board of Supervisors. Although unsuccessful in both attempts, he still continued to be very active and influential in
- the community in many other ways.

When asked to nominate someone as our club's "Heart of a Hero", Several of our members immediately recommended Bob Pegg even though he passed away almost 25 years ago and is only a part of our past to many new members. His obituary called him a "community activist" and we feel he deserves to be recognized as the type ofperson we might all try to emulate, especially as it relates to his tireless work for Kiwanis and other community groups and, as we near Veteran's Day, for his valiant service to our country. We are pleased to submit Bob E.Pegg as our "Heart of a Hero" from the Kiwanis Club of Simi Valley
