#### 4th of July Harbor 5K/10K




While our members were out on the course keeping runners safe, six KIWIN'S provided coffee for runners and volunteers.




### Conejo Vatley-Tune



Our thanks to long-time valley resident Mick Mahan, owner of Parma Pizzeria Napoletana in Thousand Oaks, who ran a fundraiser on November 15 from 5pm to closing. Parma donated 20% the proceeds to the Ventura County Community Foundation to aid people affected by the tragedies of that month. In addition, for firefighters, police, FBI and first responders, if they were in uniform or showed their badges that night, dinner was on the house.

After the tragic events at the Borderline on November 17, 2018 owners Mike and Debby Giovinazzo of Sunland Vintage Winery hosted a fundraiser where 100% of the profits were donated to the 12 families through VCCF. One of the 12 families happened to be a wine club member, so the loss hit particularly close to home. It was a party with a purpose, and when the evening was over, \$24,000 had been raised for the 12 families. A week after the fundraiser, another wine club member asked if she could bring her group to the Winery for healing, line dancing, smiling and togetherness. Today, Sunland Vintage Winery clears their floors on the 4th Thursday of every month to welcome this group, and the community, until Borderline can reopen its doors again somewhere in the Conejo Valley.


