Thank you to everyone who attended, and a special thank you to our gracious host clubs for providing dinner as well as dessert!

And the **Mid-Year Conference** occurred in San Diego on February 12. Thank you to all who attended to represent Division 42 at this important event. The Mid-Year Conference got me thinking about the **District Convention**. This year, it will be held in Palm Springs (Indian Wells) from August 4-6, 2022. Please take a moment now to put these dates of your calendars.

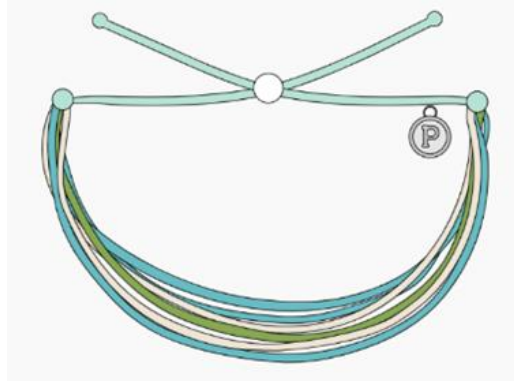

The Thousand Oaks Club has entered our "Bikes for Youth" project in the annual Kiwanis International Signature Project Contest. Our project provides bicycles, either new or used-and-reconditioned, to disadvantaged youth who need them for basic transportation to school and work, for example. The primary target group is teenagers. Local non-profits that serve low-income families select deserving recipients. During the last Kiwanis year, we gave out 104 bikes, and another 38 have been placed so far this year. Each Kiwanis District selects two Signature Projects (one by a small club, the other by a large club) to compete at the International level. The winners will be announced at the KI annual convention in Indianapolis this June. We're hoping Cal-Nev-Ha picks our project to represent the large clubs in the district, and that it does well at KI.



The Kiwanis Kween, Sherrill Hyink, leads the Thousand Oaks Club's "Lunch Bunch." We prepare 70 sack lunches and deliver them to Harbor House on the first Thursday of every month. Harbor House is a local non-profit serving the homeless. Our K-Kids, led by advisor Cristy Warner, pitch in by decorating some of the lunch sacks. Members who are part of the Lunch Bunch team include Sherrill Hyink, Past Lieutenant Governor Katy Porter, Cristy Warner, Kathy Smiley, Arnie Rudman, and John Prescott.

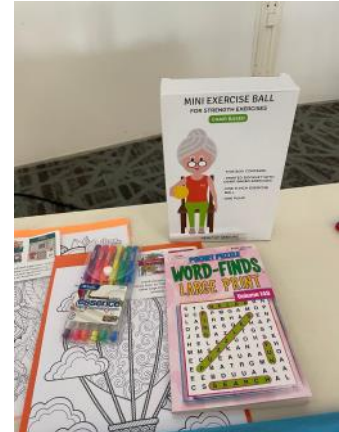

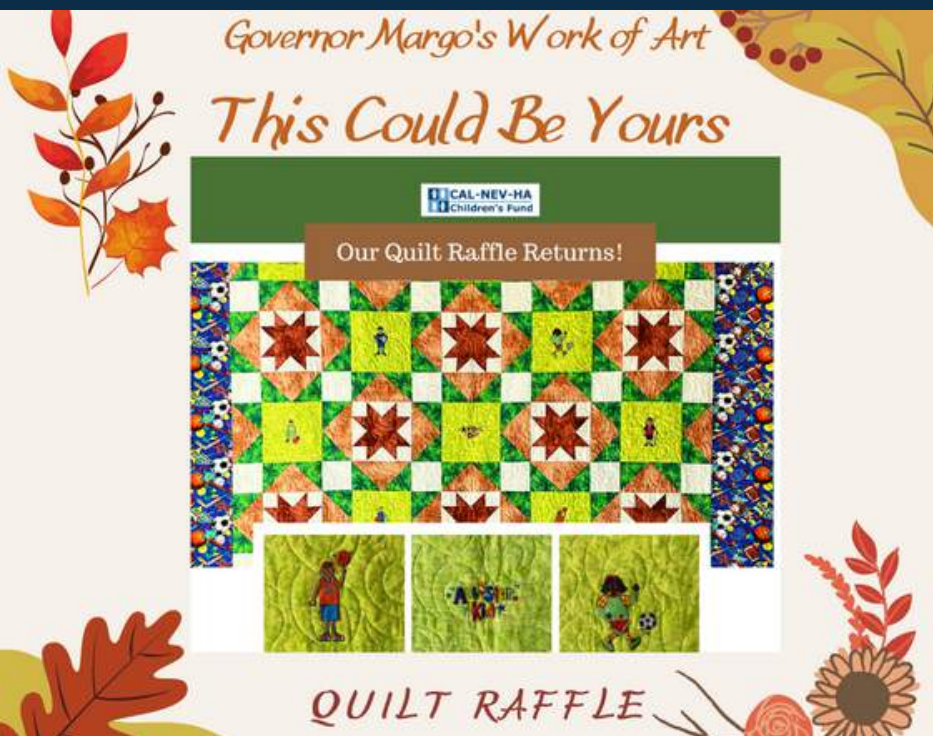
