That's why I am so happy to be a member of Kiwanis. It is an organization dedicated to improving the lives of the most vulnerable people in the world: children. And my involvement in this organization allows me to get out of my own thoughts and troubles for a few moments and focus, with the rest of you, on improving the lives of others. It is one way that I strive to live well, and create a life of service, love, and joy.

And here's a little housekeeping: We need a Service Leadership Program (SLP) chair for our division. If you or anyone you know has a heart for SLPs and just a little bit of time to dedicate to the role, we could use your help. As with any leadership opportunity in Kiwanis, if you just say yes to the opportunity to serve in this capacity, the support team will form around you! Please talk to Debbie, to me, or to Ute if you are interested in helping out in this, or in any other capacity at the division level.

Also, there will be no DCM in June. We will reconvene on July 14th for a DCM hosted by the Thousand Oaks Club.

All clubs should now be in the process of electing officers and directors for the 2022-2023 Kiwanis year, which starts on October 1.

And finally, the District Convention (DCON) is fast approaching. It will be held in Palm Springs (Indian Wells) from August 4-6, 2022. Let's have a great turnout for that one, and let's have a great time in the desert!




