Moorpark honored Barbara Eisenberg, and Santa Barbara honored yours truly. Santa Barbara also honored Anita Dominocielo-Ho with the prestigious **Tablet of Honor** award.

We took a moment to thank and honor Ron Smith for seven years of service as our division treasurer, and we thanked Debbie Heaslip for agreeing to step into that position going forward.
