The I's Have It!

Wow, here it is September already, the last month of the Kiwanis administrative year. Some would take this opportunity to look back on what we've done - and we've accomplished a lot. But I'd rather take this moment to look ahead, to point the way for plotting a course to future growth and success for our Division and all the clubs in it. Fortunately, having attended our District Convention in Las Vegas last month, I got a good look at a sound strategy and excellent tools for planning our Kiwanis future initiated and provided by our International parent.

The program is called the I-Plan, and it is a strategic plan, or roadmap, designed to be used by each district and club as a guide for creating and achieving solid goals for the future. Our District has completed its I-Plan, and now it is calling on all clubs to create their own locally-focused I-Plans by Mid-Year Conference time. The I-Plan focuses on four overlapping priority goal areas, each given a descriptive name beginning with the letter "I:" *Inspiration* - focusing on membership and engagement, *Impact* - aiming for meaningful service, *Image* - promoting our Kiwanis image, and *Investment* - to insure financial viability.

You've likely already seen elements of several of these four pillars. Inspiration is fundamentally the continuation of The Formula, with the common goal to build, retain, and support a growing Kiwanis membership network. Providing resources for opening new clubs and especially for strengthening existing clubs is the focus here. Using service and leadership development opportunities to invite new members is a key idea.

The goal of the Impact pillar is to perform meaningful service, with service to children as our priority. The strategies here are to improve the support and growth of our Service Leadership Programs, to make sure our service is aligned with community needs, to identify and develop a signature project for every club, and to encourage hands-on service projects. The #KidsNeedKiwanis campaign emanates from this priority.

Image is the pillar that focuses on enhancing our brand and making what Kiwanis stands for known worldwide. Promoting signature projects, unifying the brand and logos, increasing community knowledge of our mission, and improving name recognition are all strategies to achieve this goal. We need to get the word out! Use the #KidsNeedKiwanis materials.

None of the foregoing can get very far, though, without the Investment pillar. Financial stability and responsible stewardship in all clubs is paramount. We need to re-think dues structures, find non-dues sources of revenue, and develop financial education.

Now that I've spent the time getting you forward-focused, there is one looking-back "I" to share. I want to thank you all for your hard work and dedication, for your ideas and energy, and for the love you share with me for Kiwanis. I've been overwhelmed by your support. This has been one of the best years of my life, and I'm grateful for getting to know better many of the great Kiwanians of this division. I ask only that you do your best to keep up the good work. Now go and get started on those I-Plans!






