#### The Fruit of Intentions

My father, Albert, was a World War II veteran and Purple Heart with a cluster recipient. He was also one of the most generous persons I've known.

When he went off to war, he had every intention of coming back to the love of his life, my mother, Rachel. It was that intention that I'm quite sure drove him to be the best soldier he could be, by protecting himself and the men around him. He shared a story of not wanting to leave behind his wounded friend James in a fox hole, but was ordered to. He also told us about running alone through the landmine-infested Hürtgen Forest in Germany in 1944. It's a miracle that my siblings and I are even here.

I always knew my father to give a hand to those in need. In his retirement years, he would take his broom and walk up to the corner market on Vineyard Ave. in El Rio and sweep the parking lot just so that our little community looked clean and tidy to passersby. Some days he would drive and go look for his longtime friend who lived on the streets of Oxnard and bring him home and feed him and then give him some work so that he could put some money in his pocket to help him survive. My father gave me a front seat to the fruits of good intentions.

As much as I feel I fall short, I will continue to work on my intentions.

Good intentions are what separates us Kiwanians and other service group members from the rest of the world. Our intention to make the world a better place comes from a generous place that each of us has.

As I reflect on the two celebratory events I attended this past Veteran's Day weekend, I think of the sacrifices these men and women made. I think of the sacrifices they made of themselves and their families. They risked it all to protect us and to protect democracy. I think of my father running through the forest in Germany and his intention to make it back home. I think of his generous heart and his warm smile that everybody loved.

In honor of those who served and fought for us, I ask you all to have the intention to be generous, to be kind, and to be thankful for your opportunity to make this world a better place.

My father would have been 100 years old today as I write this on November 14th. We had 96 great years with him.


