The month of February is best known for Valentine's Day on February 14th. Valentine's Day originated as a Christian feast day honoring an early Christian martyr named Saint Valentine. Over the years, it has become a significant cultural, religious, and commercial celebration of romance and love in many regions of the world.

A whopping 145 million Valentine's Day cards are exchanged every February 14 (and that's not even including all those kids' valentines exchanged in classrooms!) Chocolate and candy sales reach profits of \$1 billion during the Valentine season, with 36 million heart-shaped boxes of chocolate sold. 22% of Americans bought fresh flowers or plants as gifts for Valentine's Day.

But February is so much more than Valentine's Day. Black History Month has been celebrated in February for over 40 years. We celebrate Presidents Day on February 20th (Happy Birthday Abe 2/12 and George 2/22.) The Mardi Gras Carnival is on February 21st in New Orleans. And, if you were born in February, your birthstone is an amethyst, and your flower is a primrose. But for Kiwanians, probably the most meaningful date is February 17, which is Random Acts of Kindness Day. It is a day to spread our love to others through words, gestures and acts of service. See the end of this newsletter for fun ideas on how you can spread the love. One way I like to spread love is by baking some sweet treats and sharing them with others. Please enjoy this delicious, easy favorite with lots of options that you can personalize to your liking:

#### Ute's Adaptable Cake

BATTER:

1 cake mix (choose your flavor)

1 small pkg. instant pudding mix (choose your flavor that compliments the cake)

Note: I like yellow cake with vanilla pudding, but other delicious combinations are chocolate cake with chocolate pudding, lemon cake with lemon, spice cake with butterscotch, white cake with pistachio....be creative).

8 oz. sour cream

4 eggs

 $\frac{1}{2}$  cup oil (I use canola)

<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> cup warm water

-Mix all ingredients until smooth.

STREUSEL MIXTURE (Optional to add the streusel, but it is delicious):

<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> cup white sugar - <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cup brown sugar - 3 T. cocoa powder - 1 t. cinnamon - 1 cup chocolate chips - Mix with a fork. (You can add nuts or experiment with other spices/ingredients to your liking)

DIRECTIONS:

-Pour half the batter into a well-greased Bundt or 13 x 9 pan (I like using a Bundt pan) -If using streusel, Sprinkle <sup>2</sup>/<sub>3</sub> of the streusel mix, add remaining batter, then top with streusel. -Cut through with a knife to swirl streusel through batter

-Bake 350 degrees for approximately 55-60 minutes or until toothpick comes out clean -ENJOY!


Our first meeting of the year was well attended and held at Studio B in Ventura. We worked on planning great fundraisers for our Key Clubs and other local youth groups.


- 1. Compliment at least 5 people.
