Asian Lettuce Wraps

Here is an easy and light recipe which is perfect for summer. This is a very forgiving recipe so you can add/omit ingredients to your taste.

For the Filling

- 1 lb. ground chicken or turkey (tofu or meat substitute works well too)
- 1 - 1½ cup mushrooms chopped (crimini, white, shitake, or your favorite)
- 8 ounce can water chestnuts; drained and diced
- 1 - 2 cups other veggies to your liking (I use chopped onion, carrots, celery, cabbage, jalapeno, and bean sprouts)
- 3 green onions; thinly sliced
- salt and pepper to taste
- 2 - 3 Tbsp. cooking oil

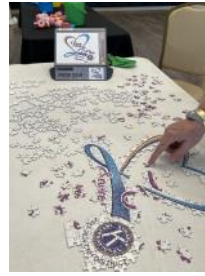

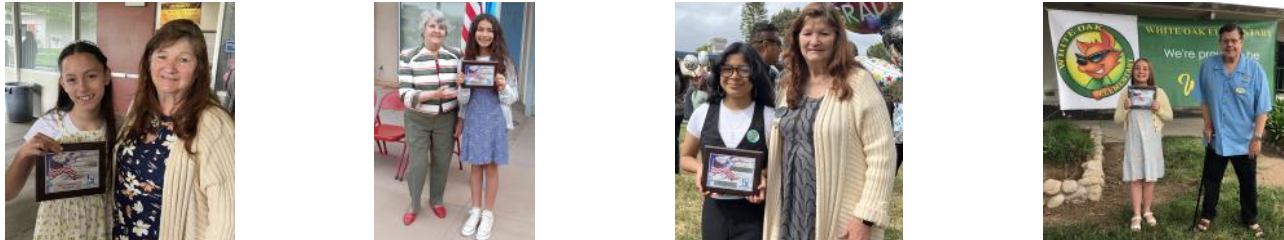

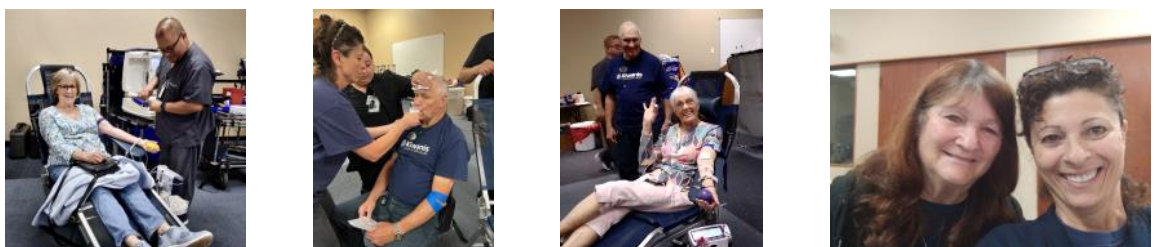
Hope of America Awards were presented by our members to an outstanding culminating student at each of 22 elementary and middle schools, including two private schools, throughout Simi Valley.

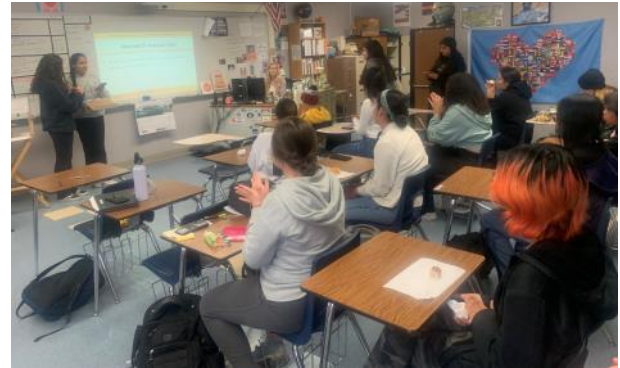
End-Of-Year Meetings for our Service Leadership Clubs

(Lt. Gov. Uté's Asian Lettuce Wraps recipe, continued)

For the Sauce

- 1/4 - 1/3 cup hoisin sauce
- 2 - 3 Tbsp. soy sauce
- 2 Tbsp. rice vinegar
- 2 Tbsp. sesame oil
- 2 Tbsp. Sriracha
- 1/4 teaspoon Red chili flakes (I like it spicy so I use more)
- 1 - 2 Tbsp. brown sugar
- 1 small shallot; diced
- 1 - 2 teaspoon fresh grated ginger
- 2 - 4 cloves garlic, grated or minced finely

For Assembly

- 1 head lettuce, keep leaves whole (butter, romaine, or iceberg are good)
- Sesame seeds; for garnish
- 1 green onion; sliced for garnish

Instructions:

In a small bowl, whisk together all of the sauce ingredients until combined. Set aside. In a large frying pan or wok, add oil and bring to a medium-high heat. Add chicken/turkey/tofu and cook until browned and crumbly. Add in mushrooms, green onions, your favorite veggies and cook until tender. Add water chestnuts and bean sprouts and briefly cook until tender crisp. Stir until combined. Reduce the heat to medium and add the sauce. Stir to coat the meat/veggie mixture and then cover with a lid for about 2 -3 minutes to let the sauce absorb into the ingredients. Add salt and pepper to taste. If you prefer your filling to be sweeter add more sugar; if you prefer more of a savory flavor, add more soy sauce.

To serve, spoon meat/veggie mixture into lettuce leaves. Garnish with green onions and sesame seeds. Eat like a taco. Enjoy!
