Debbie's Delicious Corn-Bread (this is the best corn-bread I ever had!)

3 eggs – room temperature $1 \frac{1}{4}$ c. buttermilk CAMARILLO 1 stick of butter – set aside 2 Tbsp. 4 Tbsp. sugar 2 boxes of Jiffy combread mix 1 Tbsp. honey Cast Iron skillet (or round cake pans) -Whisk eggs; add buttermilk and 6 Tbsp. melted butter. Mix thoroughly. -Add dry ingredients (sugar and cornbread mix) in a separate bowl and mix well. -Add dry ingredients to the wet mixture. Stir until lumps are gone. -Melt 1 Tbsp. butter you set aside and use it to coat the cast iron skillet (or cake pans) completely. -Pour batter into skillet, bake at 350 for 40-45 minutes until inserted toothpick comes out clean. -Melt remaining 1 Tbsp. butter and 1 Tbsp. honey together. Brush on the top of the

cornbread when hot. Enjoy!






BUNCO FUN
