This is my last newsletter as Lt. Governor and as I reminisce, I am so proud of what our Division has accomplished over the past year.

- Signature Project For my signature project, Warm Up the Community, Division 42 collected 463 coats for students in need. That far exceeded our goal of one coat per member.
- DCM's Despite multiple location changes, including Kidstream, Cal Lutheran Thousand Oaks and Oxnard campuses, and Art Trek, our DCM's continued to have excellent attendance (averaging 50 members per meeting). Thank you Temo and Mary for securing new locations! In addition, our DCM meetings were also held via zoom which gave members more options to be involved. Thank you Mark for helping with all things technological!
- Patch Program Nine of our clubs participated and earned patches for our Patch Challenges, and we gave out a total of 29 patches! A big thank you to Barbara and Debbie for keeping track and implementing this fun program which promotes a sense of pride, camaraderie and even some friendly competition.
- U.S.A. My theme was U.S.A. which was an acronym for: Unify, Simplify and Amplify. This past year, we did just that. We Unified as a division and had high attendance from members and SLP members at all our DCM meetings. We had multiple clubs' team up and join neighboring clubs to volunteer or attend events. And, together, we collected 463 coats for needy students in Ventura County. We Simplified by offering our DCM meetings via zoom and consistently had several members who could not join us in person zoom-in. Our award-winning newsletter continued to consolidate all club and Division news in one place so information was readily available on our Division 42 website at any time. A huge thanks to Nick Esser for creating our award-winning newsletter and maintaining our website. We Amplified our Clubs on social media as well as local publications and websites. 

#### **Make Sure to Process Member Adds and Drops!**

It is important to remember that membership changes (adds and drops) must be made through the <u>Kiwanis Connect</u> member management system by October 10th. Kiwanis International extends the time to process member drops until October10th for the 2022-2023 current year ending on September 30th. Any membership additions starting on October 1, 2023, will be reflected on your club's dues invoice for the new 2023-2024 Kiwanis year.

#### **REVISED 8-23-2023**

#### **Kiwanis International Youth Protection Policies and Guidelines**

#### **CNH District Suggested Compliance Actions**

As many of you are aware, Kiwanis International recently redesigned their web site. By doing that, they rendered all previous links and/or QR code references useless. The links that were sent to you in late July and early August, which attempted to simplify your clubs Annual Youth Protection training compliance, were also rendered useless.

After some discussion and maneuvering, we have been able to reestablish the links for the training, both for the narrated slide presentation (24-minute video) and the 2-page Youth Protection Policies and Procedures document. These links will be managed locally and should not be impacted by any changes within Kiwanis International.

Please understand that <u>all previous links and/or QR codes that we may have sent you are no longer active.</u> Delete them and replace them with the links below.

You are strongly encouraged to give these updated links wide distribution within your respective divisions. The previously suggested procedures of having your clubs conduct their required Annual Youth Protection Training are still valid.

- 1. Have your clubs watch the video at a special meeting and provide everyone with a copy of the Policies & Procedures document.
- 2. Send the video link to all members who did not attend the original meeting, along with a copy of the Policies & Procedures document.
- 3. Be sure your Club Secretary checks the box in the monthly report, indicating that the club has provided the required training.
- 4. Keep a copy of the meeting minutes and/or monthly report in your club files.
- 5. Be sure everyone schedules this annual training for 2024 and beyond.
