The Jonathan Clark House is a unique architectural and historical treasure that is being preserved for use by the Mequon-Thiensville community and beyond. The house was built in 1848 and was home to Jonathan and Mary Clark, their eight children, and two hired men. It was not only their home but also served as a community meeting place during a time when early settlers such as Clark, his father-in-law Peter Turck and neighbor William Bonniwell were developing the government of the township. The Friends of Jonathan Clark House is a 501c3 organization with volunteers who provide fascinating historic events and awesome tours to be enjoyed by the whole family!

The JCH is offering free scheduled tours to troops in the area. The museum is on the National Register for Historic Places, and thus a tour would satisfy requirement 7a of the Eagle-required Citizenship in the Nation Merit Badge.

CLARK HOUSE HISTORIAN

Clark House Historian Reed Perkins

THE ORIGINAL "LAPTOP"

One of the ways we collect, preserve and share the history of the Clark House and the early settlers of Mequon and Thiensville is by acquiring and interpreting furniture, tools, clothing, and various accessories that would have been familiar to the Clarks and their neighbors. One particularly fine item in our collection is this box, a treasured heirloom generously donated by JCH Friend Frederick Bock.



When closed it measures about 16 x 6 x 10 inches. It is made of wood, stained a rich golden brown. On the top is a brass plaque inscribed Rt. Beveridge / 1854. There is a lock on the front. Why? Because this is more than a nice box, it's a mid-1800s portable office, containing all that one needed to conduct professional or personal business in the Clarks' era.



Fold open the lid and it becomes a portable writing desk, also known as a lap desk or writing slope. It features an ergonomic slanted writing surface and, at the high end of the desk, spaces for quills or steel pens, ink bottles, penknives and sealing wax. And each half of the cloth-covered writing surface hinges open to provide space for storing fresh paper, letters received, and more.
