Outdoor and DPR Hours

Mon.-Sat. 8 AM to sundown Sunday 1 PM to sundown

**Membership Cards**. All members are <u>required</u> to display their membership card and sign in while using the range facilities.

**Non-members**. Non-members may only use the club facilities under the following conditions:

- 1) they are with a current NHRC club member and
- 2) they have completed a Liability form. Liability forms are located in the club house and on the outdoor range. Place completed (signed and dated) forms back in the bin. A form must be completed yearly.

**Targets.** Only paper targets and various steel targets provided by NHRC are approved for use. All other non-approved targets are not permitted and in violation of club rules.

#### **CLUB EVENTS**

**Trap Shoots.** Trap shoots are held on Tuesday evenings starting at 5:00 PM from April to October. The shoots are open to the public.


## GO BAG, NOT JUST FOR KEEPING IN THE CAR



It is hot outside, and you just cannot conceal that firearm. Have you ever thought about using your go bag that you keep in the car? If you are like me, you keep a multitude of items in your bag, the trick here is to try to keep it light enough that you don't mind carrying it.

In my bag I usually have another firearm with extra magazines, a knife, a multitool, flashlight, pens and paper and a first aid or trauma kit. That's my basic bag. You could add a few other items that would personalize it for you - like medications such as pain relievers, lip balm, Tums or some type of antacid tablet.

The idea is to get used to taking the bag with you when you get out of the car. There are many different styles available and just about all are acceptable today. Many people who are not concealed carry holders carry testical









You could use a small backpack, sling style bag, or small messenger bag as long it meets your needs and allows you easy access to your firearm also that it has an isolated compartment for the firearm and nothing else.

Shown are several examples of bags just to give you an idea of what is out there on the market. There are

all kinds of styles, shapes and sizes to suit your needs. I change bags from time to time depending upon my moods and my needs, but I always have one in the car. Actually, I have two; one for each car so I don't have to switch them back and forth and they're both set up pretty similar.





Look on YouTube where there are a lot of good videos of bags and ideas. Experiment a little bit and find out what works best for you. You may add a few things, you may subtract a few items. But you'll find it a cool thing to have and know that it's there for *Peace of Mind!* 

The saying goes that "two guns are always better than one!" Having a go bag with you

gives you a second firearm if you're still carrying on person. Another great perk to using a go bag. A word of caution in closing, *do not leave your bag unattended* as it does contain a firearm and ammunition that you are responsible for. Enjoy the summer! And remember to carry concealed and train.

In the range house, Bill Behret put a fresh coat of paint on the desk while Jeff McElrath and Helen Kidd fixed the dropped ceiling tile.




Helen sorted wood that could be used for braces in the new building for Jeff and Ray McGlynn. They nailed support pieces in the kitchen area.
