Indoor Hours

Mon.-Sat. 8 AM to **10 PM**Sunday 1 PM to **10 PM**

Outdoor and DPR Hours

Mon.-Sat. 8 AM to sundown Sunday 1 PM to sundown

Membership Cards. All members are <u>required</u> to display their membership card and sign in while using the range facilities.

Non-members. Non-members may only use the club facilities under the following conditions:

- 1) they are with a current NHRC club member and
- 2) they have completed a Liability form. Liability forms are located in the club house and on the outdoor range. Place completed (signed and dated) forms back in the bin. A form must be completed yearly.

Targets. Only paper targets and various steel targets provided by NHRC are approved for use. All other non-approved targets are not permitted and in violation of club rules.

Trap Shoots. Trap shoots are held on Tuesday evenings starting at 5:00 PM from April to October. The shoots are open to the public.

NHRC Gun Show. NHRC hosts an annual Firearms and Outdoor Sports Show every January. The 2023 Gun Show will be held on January 14 and 15 at the Nescopeck Township Volunteer Fire Company off Route 93. Show hours are Saturday from 9-4 PM and Sunday from 9-3 PM.

GUN LAWS ON THE HORIZON



The increase in violence involving guns have brought back the push for more gun control laws and gun confiscation. On June 2, 2022, Rep. Mondaire Jones (D-NY), a lawmaker on the House Judiciary Committee stated "that efforts to confiscate civilian-owned firearms will not be stopped. He then threatened "we will expand" the Supreme Court if it objects to new gun control measures." Pennsylvania lawmakers are using these recent events to push for the same gun control here in PA. It is time to get involved!

AMERICAN RIMFIRE ASSOCIATION SHOOTS

Nescopeck Hunting and Rifle Club has added .22 rimfire shoots at the range! It's offical, NHRC is now a sanctioned ARA club. Matches will be held on the outdoor range monthly. The first shoot is scheduled for Saturday, July 2, 2022.


What is the ARA? The American Rimfire Association (ARA) is a sanctioning body for .22 long rifle (lr) bench rest competitions. There are two classes offered, Unlimited and Factory. Both the Unlimited and Factory class give shooters 20 minutes to shoot a 25 bull target for a maximum score of 2500. Below is an example of the ARA target.

The History of the ARA: ARA was started in April 1998 by a group of .22lr shooters who wanted a great organization for competitive .22lr benchrest competition. They formulated the ARA statistics on which the awards are based and they kept up with all match reports and shooter statistics. In addition, they started the ARA News and the ARA website in an effort to get the information out to all ARA participants.

In 2010, ARA was bought by Dan Killough, whose goal was to continue the vision of the ARA founders by providing an honest competitive organization that is true to .22lr shooting. One of the most exciting changes Dan introduced in the ARA is the implementation of electronic scoring, which makes scoring targets faster and unbiased. Electronic scoring is optional but encouraged for all ARA clubs. In 2017, the ARA organization was acquired by ELEY INC, who continue to promote and expand .22lr competitions. ARA has clubs across the United States offering ARA matches and tournaments to anyone interested in precision .22lr bench rest shooting.

What kind of equipment and rifle is needed to participate?

Most likely you have a .22 rifle in your gun collection since it is low cost, has little recoil and the ammo is relatively inexpensive to shoot. A .22 firearm is great for young shooters to learn the fundamentals of firearms. If you don't own a .22, you may know someone who would allow you to shoot their gun.

There are two match classes in the ARA rules; Factory and Unlimited. The classes are based on the price of the firearm. **Factory Class:** includes any magazine or tube fed rifle in production that is readily available and produced in quantities greater than 500 with Manufacturers Suggested Retail Price (MSRP) of LESS than \$1000.00 or is included on the ARA approved factory rifle list. Any optic is allowable and may be attached to the rifle as originally designed by the manufacturer. Modifications to the .22 firearm are very limited in this classification.

Unlimited Class: Any firearm chambered for the .22 Long Rifle cartridge may be used in this class. There are no weight limits, no classes, and no dimensional restrictions to the barrels, stocks, or limits on scope magnification.

Along with the firearm, shooters will need two hundred rounds of ammo and pay a match fee of \$20.00. Anyone 7 years and older can participate in the match. This makes for a great fun family event!

Want to check an ARA shoot out in person? If you'd like to see a match before comitting, the next Factory Class Match is scheduled to be held at 9 AM on Sunday, June 19th at the Tamaqua Rifle and Pistol Club in New Ringold, PA. NHRC member Joe Senick competed at Tamaqua's April match. He placed second in the adult class and came home with a nice medal (right).


