You were a godsend when you arrived on the scene. You made it possible for Jim and me to get some sleep. You provided Peep with solace during her difficult nights. Eventually you crafted the "dream team" of Peep's angels that cared for Peep with love and compassion, so much so that her health and quality of life actually improved under your care. We are so grateful that Peep's last years in her beautiful home were good ones, thanks to you. She wanted to stay in her home until the end and you made her dream come true.

For Peep to stay in her home meant that she could not be in any of her children's home's. Thank you for providing us with the worry-free care that we needed while we cared for our own families, in our own homes, many miles away. We experienced so much "life" while you were with Peep and you were a rock throughout: Linda's brave battle and eventual death from cancer, Jay's heart attack, Jim's heart attack, Jim's heart surgery, my mother's multiple hospitalizations and brushes with death. You allowed us to deal with these "bumps in the road", knowing there would be perfect continuity of care for Peep. Knowing this made these difficult times so much less difficult for all of us to deal with. Thank you for this as well.

Your team of angels was also a comfort to "the Harrys", following their terrible loss of Linda in November of 2021. We can never thank you enough for the love, the caring and the purpose you provided for them during the difficult time following the loss of a devoted wife and mother. They are much better equipped to face the hard realities of their situation after the daily kindness and compassion you bestowed upon them as they adjusted to their loss.


I also owe you a personal thank you for helping me find a caregiver for my own mother and for your help with the management of same. I am happy that we have a reason to stay in touch.
