WINTER IN WITTENBERG: THE WEIHNACHTSMARKT

The Weihnachtsmarkt is a beloved German tradition during the Advent and Christmas season. With mulled wine, candied apples, gingerbread cookie hearts, roasted nuts, Christmas ornaments, artisan craftmakers, carousels and a ferris wheel, there's much to love about the Weihnachtsmarkt. The Weihnachtsmarkt in Wittenberg celebrated its 555th year in 2023! Which makes me think that Martin Luther and Katarina von Bora must have enjoyed a few of these during their time in Wittenberg. The market's kick-off event was led by Rev. Mattias Keilholz, pastor of the Stadtkirche (Town Church), and Bürgermeister Torsten Zugehör, mayor of Wittenberg. It is very powerful to witness how involved the Wittenberg churches are in public life and with the state/town. Another example of this is the weekly Stadtgebet (town-wide worship) which is held in the town square in the summertime, and is promoted and supported by the town of Wittenberg. It demonstrates to locals and visitors that the church has a prevalent role in the life of the town and its identity, even though church membership in the area is only about 12%, one of the lowest rates in all of Germany. The ecumenecial relationships in Wittenberg are very strong and fruitful, seeking to do more things together for the benefit of not just church members but all of the town's residents. ADVENT TRADITIONS

The picture on the right is of the Advent wreath in the Stadtkirche (Town Church). Unlike most ELCA congregations which use blue candles, the Advent wreath candles in Germany are almost always red. The Stadt-kirche wreath has a special feature: small candles represent each day of the week, while the large, red candles represent each Sunday in Advent. Each day during midday prayer, one candle is lit. The picture on the right was therefore taken on the 5th day of Advent (Dec. 7th, 2023), when it was my turn to lead midday prayer.



SERVICE OF INSTALLATION



My service of installation was held on Friday, January 12th, 2024 at the Fronleichnamkapelle (Chapel of Corpus Christi), the small chapel next to the Town Church. About 35 people gathered for this service, coming mainly from the local Wittenberg community and some of my dear friends from Leipzig. Rev. Rachel Eskesen, ELCA Europe Desk Director, led the installation and Rev. Dr. Meghan Aelabouni, ELCA theologian and pastor at the Lutheran Church of the Redeemer in Jerusalem, preached about how love makes a sacred place holy. The picture on the left shows (from left to right) Rev. Dr. Meghan Aelabouni, Rev. Rachel Eskesen, Rev. Bridget Gautieri, and Rev Dr. Gabriele Metzner, the superintendant of Protestant churches in the Greater Wittenberg Region. ELCA VISITORS!


