1.2 Million Florida Commuters Have Saved \$112 Million In 2023 With Toll Relief Program

The Toll Relief Program introduced by Governor DeSantis and enacted by the Florida Legislature launched on January 1, 2023. Now in its third month, Florida commuters continue to see significant savings as a result of the program. In the month of March, account credits of \$41.5 million were posted to 1 million customer accounts.

The year-long program automatically gives customers with at least 35 monthly toll transactions a 50 percent credit to their account. Since the program's inception in January, more than \$112 million in Toll Relief credits have been issued benefiting 1.2 million Floridians. "With a savings of \$112 million received so far, Florida families are seeing real assistance from the Toll Relief program every month," said Florida Department of Transportation Secretary Jared W. Perdue, P.E. "The Department is thrilled to continue our support of this program and we thank Governor DeSantis for providing our customers with additional opportunities to meet today's economic challenges."

The Toll Relief program builds on the successful SunPass Savings Program that concluded in December 2022 and resulted in 384,000 drivers saving over \$18 million.
