Don't leave delivered parcels outside your property.

- **Pegasus Scheme** – if you have speech or communication challenges the Pegasus card scheme streamlines the help you receive in urgent situations.

- **SignVideo BSL Interpreter** - if you're a British Sign Language User, our SignVideo partnership means you're just a click away from a remote BSL interpreter.

- **Police Link Officers for Deaf people (PLOD)** – if you are deaf, you can SMS text us on 07967 986130.

- **Herbert Protocol** – if you care for someone with dementia or Alzheimer's, the Herbert Protocol ensures we have the essential info to act fast and keep them safe, if they go missing.
