## 2024 Proposal for Reserve Fund

- 1. Eliminate specific allocations.
- 2. Set aside \$2000 for 'Matching Funds.' Any member who wishes to make a personal donation of up to \$100 for an existing CWONC project, the club will match her donation. These donations will not require club approval.
- 3. If a member wants to propose a **new** project (e.g. Boys & Girls club or Operation HOPE), the donation will come out of the reserve fund. Just like any other new project, the proposal must first be reviewed by the executive board and then voted on by the members. If we decide to continue the project the following year, it will be worked into the annual budget.
- 4. If a chairpersonneeds more funds for an existing project beyond what's in the budget (e.g. for a special event, or to grant more scholarships), she can make that proposal for the members to vote on.
- 5. As emergencies come up (e.g. wildfires) any member can make a proposalto make a donation out of the reserve fund. Like any new project, this will require executive board review and members' approval.
- 6. Once a year, the members will vote on making a more impactful donation (say, \$1000 to \$2000) to one of our existing projects.



7. We won't allow the reserve balance to fall below \$3000 so that we always have a reserve for emergencies.
