Sojourner Truth
(c. 1797 – November 26, 1883)

born Isabella "Belle" Baumfree, Sojourner Truth was an African-American abolitionist and women's rights activist. Truth was born into slavery in Swartekill, Ulster County, New York, but escaped with her infant daughter to freedom in 1826. After going to court to recover her son in 1828, she became the first black woman to win such a case against a white man. During the Civil War, Truth helped recruit black troops for the Union Army. She gave herself the name Sojourner Truth in 1843 after she became convinced that God had called her to leave the city and go into the countryside, testifying to "that was in her".



Rosa Parks
(February 4, 1913 – October 26, 2005)

was an American activist in the civil rights movement best known for her pivotal role in the Montgomery, Alabama bus boycott. The United States Congress has called her "the first lady of civil rights" and "the mother of the freedom movement".



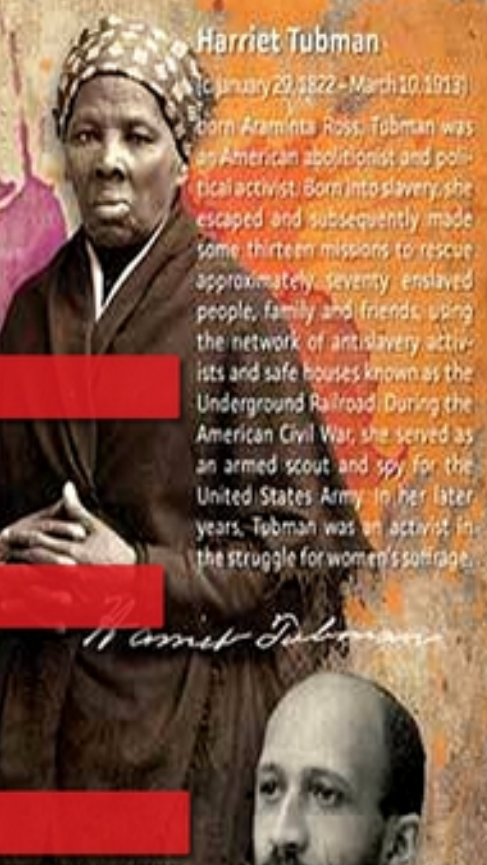
Booker T. Washington
(c. 1856 – November 14, 1931)

was an American educator, author, orator and advisor to presidents of the United States. Between 1890 and 1915, Washington was the dominant leader in the African-American community and the leading voice of the former slaves and their descendants. Washington was also a key proponent of African American businesses and one of the founders of the National Negro Business League. His base was the Tuskegee Institute, a historically black college in Tuskegee, Alabama.



Harriet Tubman
(c. January 29, 1822 – March 10, 1913)

born Araminta Ross, Tubman was an American abolitionist and political activist. Born into slavery, she escaped and subsequently made some thirteen missions to rescue approximately seventy enslaved people, family and friends, using the network of antislavery activists and safe houses known as the Underground Railroad. During the American Civil War, she served as an armed scout and spy for the United States Army. In her later years, Tubman was an activist in the struggle for women's suffrage.



Frederick Douglass
(c. February 1818 – February 20, 1895)

was an American social reformer, abolitionist, orator, writer, and statesman. After escaping from slavery in Maryland, he became a national leader of the abolitionist movement in Massachusetts and New York, gaining note for his oratory and incisive antislavery writings. In his time, he was described by abolitionists as a living counter-example to slaveholders' arguments that slaves lacked the intellectual capacity to function as independent American citizens.



GREAT LEADERS ARE BORN, RAISED, & ELECTED

Benjamin Banneker
(November 9, 1731 – October 9, 1806)

was a free African-American almanac author, surveyor, naturalist, and farmer. Born in Baltimore, Maryland to a free African-American woman and a former slave, Banneker had little formal education and was largely self-taught. He is known for being part of a group led by Major Andrew Ellicott that surveyed the original borders of the District of Columbia, the federal capital district of the United States.



Malcolm X
(May 19, 1925 – February 21, 1965)

was an American Muslim minister, spokesman for the Nation of Islam and human rights activist who was a popular figure during the civil rights movement. Articulate, passionate and a naturally gifted and inspirational orator, Malcolm X exhorted blacks to cast off the shackles of racism "by any means necessary," including violence. The fiery civil rights leader broke with the NOI shortly before his assassination at the Audubon Ballroom in New York City.



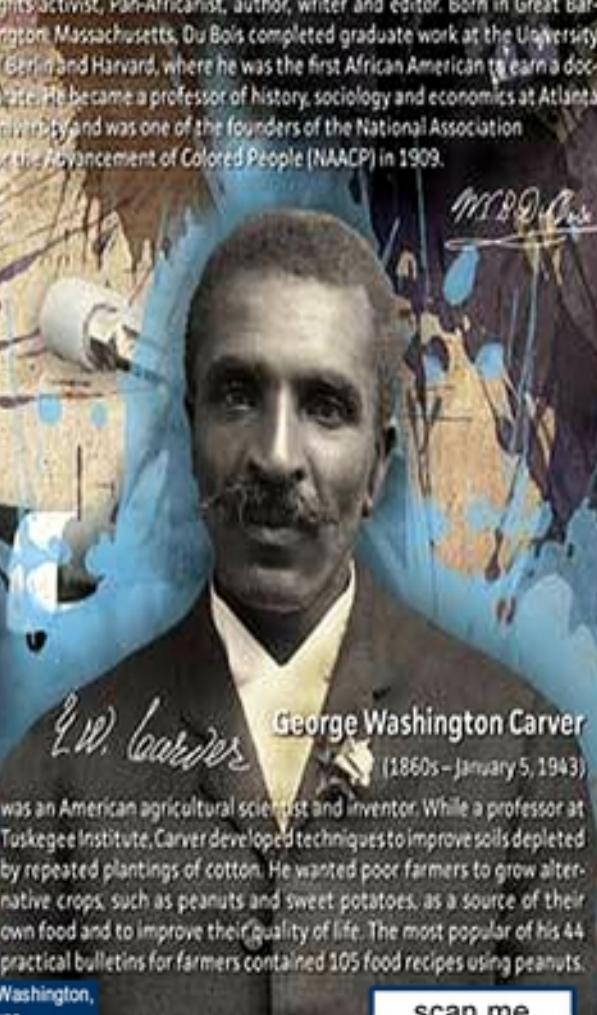
Martin Luther King, Jr.
(January 15, 1929 – April 4, 1968)

was an American Baptist minister and activist who became the most visible spokesperson and leader in the civil rights movement from 1955 until his assassination in 1968. Born in Atlanta, Georgia, King is best known for advancing civil rights through nonviolence and civil disobedience, tactics his Christian beliefs and the nonviolent activism of Mahatma Gandhi helped inspire.



George Washington Carver
(1860s – January 5, 1943)

was an American agricultural scientist and inventor. While a professor at Tuskegee Institute, Carver developed techniques to improve soils depleted by repeated plantings of cotton. He wanted poor farmers to grow alternative crops, such as peanuts and sweet potatoes, as a source of their own food and to improve their quality of life. The most popular of his 44 practical bulletins for farmers contained 105 food recipes using peanuts.

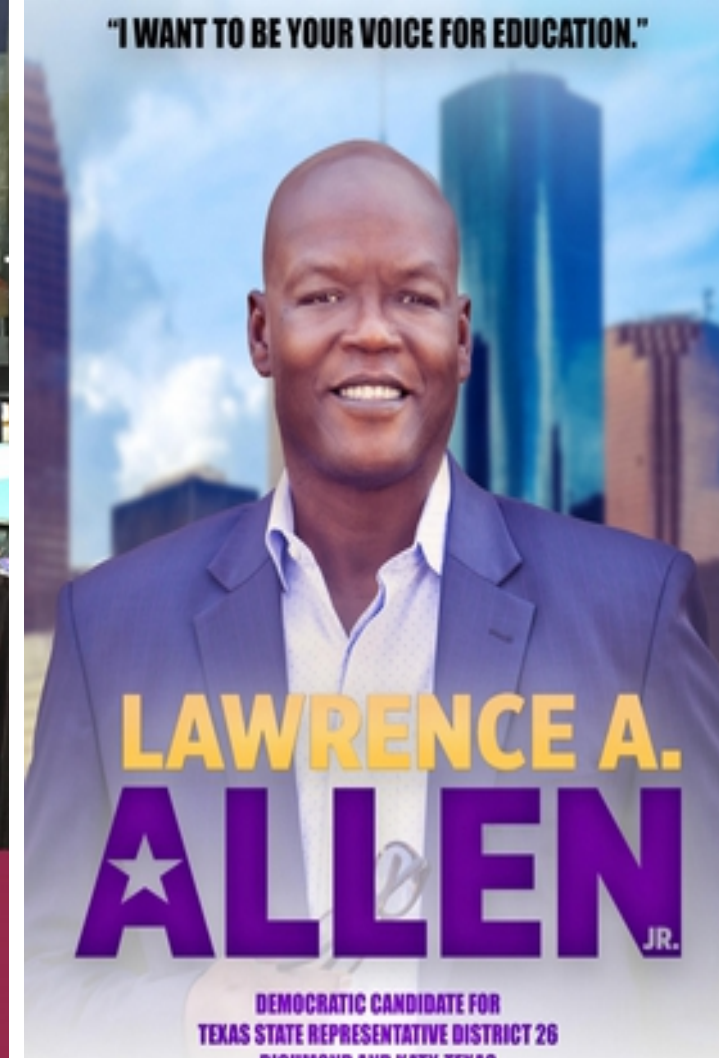

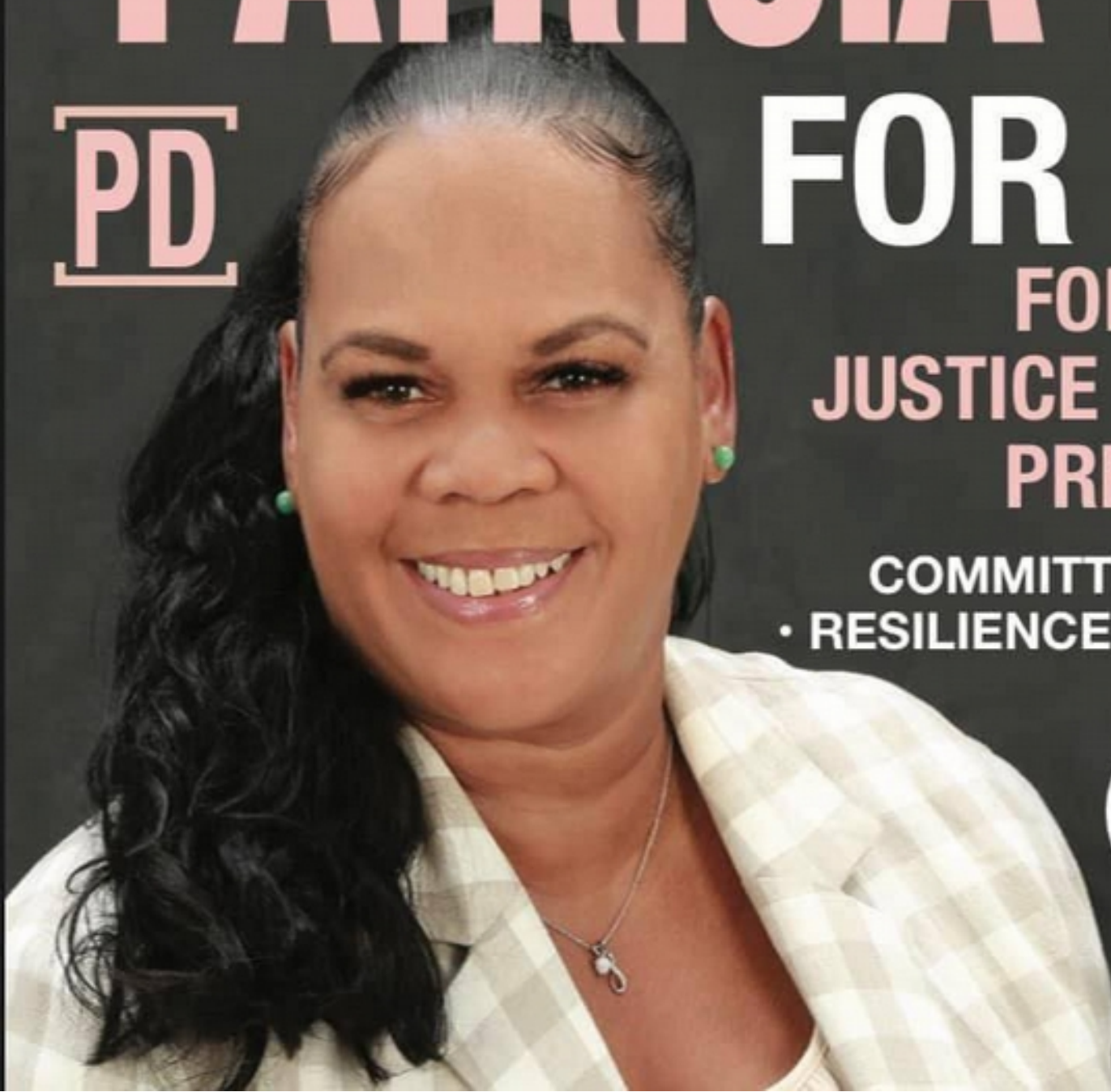
