General Vet Notes: 10/31/22: Senior/geriatric dog, brief exam P has mature cataracts/nuclear sclerosis will decrease some vision ability. Very stiff when walking suspect osteoarthritis. Moderate to severe dental disease. Muscle wasting/underweight condition. Added to list to evaluate bloodwork and QOL assessment. - BOK

11/7/22: P is BAR, very skinny/underweight. Adding to twice daily feeding schedule. Feed Adlib - soft food and kibble. P needs a good brushing/shedding. Drew blood, in house panel chemistry is WNL/unremarkable. At this time there is no on going treatments. P is a senior/geriatric dog- adopters need to be aware is an older dog and even though bloodwork at this time looks good, he could have prior pre-existing conditions that we cannot detect at this time. He does need a dental and is on the list but dental at this time are booked out a few weeks. If adopters are willing to take this dog on he will need a dental asap if does not get done prior to adoption.- BOK

11/15/22: Under vet care - more observed concerns, now is vomiting consistently and having diarrhea, palpated possible abdominal mass. Concern is intestinal neoplasia. Ok to keep up front and comfort/moniotr him. Re-evaluating on daily basis, if continuing to decline humane euthanasia and QOL needs to be considered. - BOK

11/18/22: P just acting as if mouth is his biggest problem for weight gain. Put under anesthesia today to extract as many loose teeth as possible, do not have full dental unit but able to extract and chip off most tartar. P will still need more dental work done in future but extracted all loose and infected teeth possible today, P only have ~7 remaining teeth. Monitor intake/weight, might see if we can get him into foster placement for re-feeding. If not improving or if vomiting persists need to re-evaluate QOL. - BOK

11/22/22: P continues to vomit, weight loss continues, medical management not responding to, will eat a few bites but not enough to sustain. P QOL is suffering and declining. P is going to starve to death at this point if continues. Humane euthanasia recommended and

performed, declining health rapidly, end stage disease. Inhumane to continue to hold or continue medical management without any positive response. - BOK

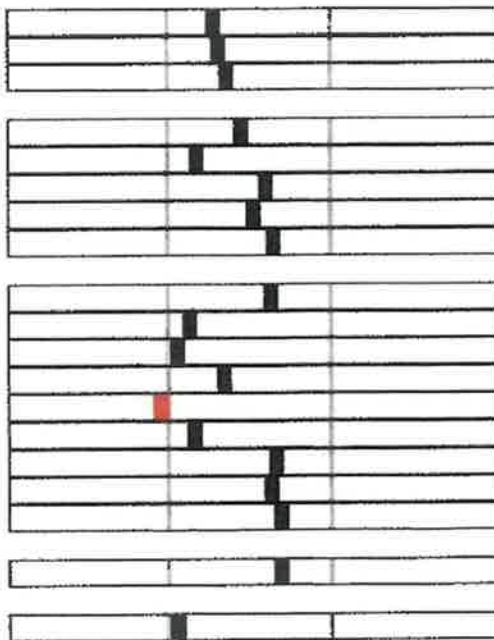

Diagnostic Interpretation for TT4

- < 1.0 µg/dL Low
- 1.0 - 2.0 µg/dL Low Normal
- 1.0 - 4.0 µg/dL Normal
- > 4.0 µg/dL High
- 2.1 - 5.4 µg/dL Therapeutic

Dogs with no clinical signs of hypothyroidism and results within the normal reference range are likely euthyroid. Dogs with low T4 concentrations may be hypothyroid or "euthyroid sick". Occasionally, hypothyroid dogs can have T4 concentrations that are low normal. Dogs with clinical signs of hypothyroidism and low or low normal T4 concentrations may be evaluated further by submission of freeT4 (fT4) and canine TSH. A high T4 concentration in a clinically normal dog is likely a variation of normal; however elevations may occur secondary to thyroid auto antibodies or rarely thyroid neoplasia. For dogs on thyroid supplement, acceptable 4-6 hour post pill total T4 concentrations generally fall within the higher end or slightly above the reference range.
