This declaration of potentially dangerous dog is based on the records of Spokane County Regional Animal Protection Service, copies of which are attached to this notice, labeled as Attachment "A", and incorporated into this document by reference.

Pursuant to SCC 5.04.033 this notice renders final the director's declaration that the dog is a potentially dangerous dog, unless the owner or keeper of the dog submits a request for an administrative review meeting to the director in writing on the form provided with this notice within fifteen (15) days of the receipt of the notice.

YOUR RESPONSIBILITY AS OWNER OF A POTENTIALLY DANGEROUS DOG.

As the owner or keeper of a potentially dangerous dog you are required by ordinance to meet the following requirements:

SCC 5.04.033(1)(e) That the owner or keeper must comply with restrictions set forth in the notice as a condition of continued ownership or keeping of the dog, and that restrictions may include, but are not limited to, those that may be imposed on the owner or keeper of a potentially dangerous dog pursuant to section 5.04.032(7);

Pursuant to SCC 5.04.033(1)(e) SCRAPS is imposing the following restrictions under SCC 5.04.032(7) pending completion of an administrative review as described above:

- (a) erection of new or additional fencing to keep the dog within the owner's or keeper's premises;
- (b) construction of a run consistent with the size of the dog within which the dog must be kept;
- (c) keeping the dog on a leash adequate to control the dog or securely fastened to a secure object when left unattended;
- (d) keeping the dog indoors at all times, except when on a leash adequate to control the dog and under the actual physical control of the owner or keeper or a competent person at least fifteen (15) years of age;
- (e) keeping the dog muzzled in a manner that will not cause injury to the dog or interfere with its vision or respiration, but will prevent it from biting any person or animal when outside a proper enclosure;
- (f) Spaying/neutering of the dog;
- (g) Microchip implanting of the dog for identification purposes. The microchip shall be implanted in accordance with policy established by the Director

Other: A,B,C,D,E. Any one or combination to prevent the dog from having any re-offense.

An owner or keeper of a potentially dangerous dog who violates any of these conditions shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.

THIS NOTICE CONSTITUTES A FINAL DETERMINATION THAT EACH OF THE ABOVE DOGS IS DECLARED TO BE A POTENTIALLY DANGEROUS DOG, UNLESS YOU REQUEST AN ADMINISTRATIVE REVIEW MEETING IN WRITING ON THE FORM PROVIDED WITH THIS NOTICE WITHIN FIFTEEN (15) DAYS OF THE RECEIPT OF THIS NOTICE. THIS NOTICE IS DEEMED RECEIVED THREE (3) DAYS FOLLOWING ITS MAILING SHOULD YOU REQUEST AN ADMINISTRATIVE REVIEW MEETING, IT WILL BE HELD WITHIN (30) DAYS OF THE RECEIPT OF YOUR REQUEST. YOU WILL BE NOTIFIED OF THE DATE, TIME AND PLACE OF THE ADMINISTRATIVE REVIEW MEETING. THE ADMINISTRATIVE REVIEW MEETING MAY BE CONDUCTED BY PHONE FOR YOUR CONVENIENCE. YOU WILL HAVE THE RIGHT TO PRESENT EVIDENCE AS TO WHY THE DOG SHOULD NOT BE FOUND POTENTIALLY DANGEROUS.

PURSUANT TO SPOKANE COUNTY CODE SECTION 5.04.033(1)(g) A FAILURE BY THE DOG OWNER OR KEEPER TO TIMELY REQUEST AN ADMINSTRATIVE REVIEW MEETING OR ATTEND AN ADMINISTRATIVE REVIEW MEETING WITH THE DIRECTOR AFTER BEING DULY NOTIFIED OF THE MEETING, SHALL CONSTITUTE A FAILURE TO EXHAUST ALL ADMINISTRATIVE REMEDIES , RENDER FINAL THE DIRECTOR'S DECLARATION THAT THE DOG IS POTENTIALLY DANGEROUS, AND PRECLUDE ANY APPEAL OF THE DIRECTOR'S DECLARATION TO THE HEARING EXAMINER, BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, OR COURT.

5.04.020 Definitions

- (12) "Dangerous dog" means any dog that (a) inflicts severe injury or multiple bites on a human being without provocation on public or private property, (b) inflicts severe injury, multiple bites, or kills an animal without provocation while the dog is off the owner's or keeper's property, or (c) has previously been declared potentially dangerous under this chapter or a previous version of this chapter or under a comparable ordinance in any jurisdiction within the state of Washington, or under RCW 16.08.080, and after the owner or keeper received notice of such declaration the dog engages in behavior that meets the definition of "potentially dangerous dog" in subsection (22) of this section; provided, a declaration of dangerous dog under part (c) of this subsection cannot become a final determination under section 5.04.032 unless and until the previous declaration of potentially dangerous dog has become final under this code or a previous version of this code. If two (2) or more dogs jointly engage in any conduct described in parts (a) or (b) of this subsection, thereby rendering proof of the individual dog that inflicted any particular injury difficult to ascertain, then regardless of the degree of participation by the individual dog(s), all such dogs shall be deemed dangerous dogs.
- (22) "Potentially dangerous dog" means any dog that when unprovoked: (a) inflicts a bite on a human being or animal either on public or private property, or (b) in a menacing fashion or apparent attitude of attack snaps at, growls at, barks at, jumps upon, restrains, chases or approaches a human being on public or private property, or (c) in a menacing fashion or apparent attitude of attack snaps at, growls at, barks at, jumps upon, restrains, or chases another animal while the dog is off the owner's or keeper's property.

5.04.032 - Determination of dangerous dog—Administrative appeal hearing and appeal—Impounding of dog.

- (1) In the event the director has sufficient articulable information to determine a dog has engaged in actions that meet the definitional elements of a dangerous dog identified in section 5.04.020(12) and may pose a threat of serious harm to human beings or animals, the director shall seize and impound the dog pending notice, hearings, appeals and other determinations hereunder. The owner or keeper of the dog shall be liable to SCRAPS for the costs and expenses of keeping such dog, unless a determination is made that the dog is neither dangerous nor a potentially dangerous dog.
- (2) When the director has sufficient information to determine that a dog is a dangerous dog as defined by section 5.04.020(12), the director shall declare the dog a dangerous dog and shall notify the owner or keeper of the dog of such determination in writing, either in person or by regular and certified mail. Any notice of determination mailed pursuant to this section shall be deemed received by the party to whom it is addressed on the third

(3rd) day after it is placed in the mail, as set forth by declaration of the sender. The notice shall contain the following information:

- (a) That the person receiving the notice is the owner or keeper of a dangerous dog as defined in section 5.04.020(20);
 - (b) The breed, color, sex, and license number (if known) of the dog;
 - (c) A copy of the records relied upon by the director that form the basis for declaring the dog to be a dangerous dog; which records may be supplemented with additional information as it becomes available;
 - (d) That receipt of the notice renders final the declaration of dangerous dog unless the owner or keeper of the dog submits a request for an administrative appeal hearing in writing to the director on a form provided with the notice within fifteen (15) days of the receipt of the notice;
 - (e) That any dog declared dangerous under this section shall be immediately impounded at the animal care and control facility at the owner's or keeper's expense until the owner or keeper fulfills the registration requirements for the dog in accordance with section 5.04.035; and that the dog will be euthanized at the direction of the director unless the owner or keeper within fifteen (15) days of receiving notice of the dangerous dog declaration either registers the dog or appeals the declaration and provisionally registers the dog pursuant to section 5.04.035 pending the results of the appeal;
 - (f) That if an administrative appeal hearing is requested, such hearing and appeal will be held and adjudicated pursuant to subsection (3) through (11) of this section; that at the hearing the records of the Director and any supplementary material shall be admissible to prove the dog is a dangerous dog; that the owner or keeper of the dog may upon request require the officer compiling the record or alternatively an officer with personal knowledge of the record to be present at the hearing. Unless such officer is unavailable; that the owner or keeper of the dog, and the Director, may call witnesses, present evidence, examine witnesses present, and be represented by counsel at the hearing; and that the burden shall be on the Director to establish by a preponderance of the evidence that the dog is a dangerous dog.
- (3) The procedures and requirements described in subsections (2)(c) through (2)(f) of this section shall apply to the dangerous dog declaration issued by the director and to any appeal of such declaration by the owner or keeper.
 - (4) If the owner or keeper of the dog requests an administrative appeal hearing within time provided in subsection (2)(e) of this section, the hearing shall be held before the Spokane County Hearing Examiner, as appointed under chapter 1.46 of Spokane County Code. The hearing shall be held within twenty (20) days after the receipt of such request, unless it is continued by the hearing examiner based on a showing of good cause. The director shall notify the owner or keeper of the date, time, and place of the hearing at least ten (10) days before the hearing date, which time for notification may be shortened by the examiner based on the agreement of the parties or good cause. The hearing is a public hearing open to public view, but participation in the hearing is limited to the parties and their witnesses.
 - (5) The administrative appeal hearing shall be electronically recorded. All testimony at the hearing shall be taken under oath, and witnesses may be subpoenaed by the hearing examiner and held in contempt if they refuse to testify. The hearing shall be conducted in accordance with the hearing examiner rules of procedure adopted by the Board of County Commissioners to the extent such rules are relevant and are not in conflict with this section.

- (6) The hearing examiner shall render an oral recommendation at the conclusion of the administrative appeal hearing or within five (5) business days thereafter, unless a written recommendation as provided in this subsection has already been prepared and filed by the examiner. The examiner shall prepare a written recommendation that includes findings of fact and conclusions of law, and shall file the recommendation with the Board of County Commissioners within fifteen (15) days of the hearing. The examiner may extend the time for issuing the oral recommendation or for filing the written recommendation upon notification of the parties, but in no event shall the written recommendation be filed more than thirty (30) days from the date of the hearing unless good cause is shown.
- (7) The hearing examiner's recommendation shall be to affirm, reverse or modify the dangerous dog declaration issued by the director. If the recommendation is to affirm the declaration, the examiner shall recommend that the requirements of section 5.04.035 be imposed upon the owner or keeper as a condition of continued ownership or keeping of the dog. If the recommendation is to modify the declaration, the examiner may recommend that the dog be deemed potentially dangerous and that reasonable conditions be imposed on the owner or keeper as a condition of continued ownership or keeping of the dog. Reasonable conditions may include but are not limited to the following measures:
- (a) Erection of new or additional fencing to keep the dog within the confines of the owner's or keeper's premises.
 - (b) Construction of a run consistent with the size of the dog within which the dog must be kept.
 - (c) Keeping the dog on a leash adequate to control the dog or securely fastened to a secure object when left unattended.
 - (d) Keeping the dog indoors at all times, except when on a leash adequate to control the dog and under the actual physical control of the owner or keeper or a competent person at least fifteen (15) years of age.
 - (e) Keeping the dog muzzled in a manner that will not cause injury to the dog or interfere with its vision or respiration, but will prevent it from biting any person or animal when outside a proper enclosure.
 - (f) Spaying/neutering of the dog.
 - (g) Microchip implanting of the dog for identification purposes.

The examiner may alternatively recommend that the director be given the authority to establish the reasonable conditions from the measures listed above, or from revisions or additions to such measures that the director deems necessary to effectuate the purposes of this chapter.

- (8) Upon receipt of the hearing examiner's written recommendation, the clerk of the Board of County Commissioners shall place consideration of the examiner's recommendation on the board's next regular meeting agenda for action. On the day the examiner files the recommendation with the board or within one (1) business day thereafter, the examiner

shall provide the electronic recording of the hearing and the documents admitted into the hearing record to the clerk of the board; mail a copy of the recommendation to the owner or keeper of the dog, and to the director, along with notice of the date, time and place of the regular meeting at which the board will take action on the recommendation; provide a copy of such notifications to the clerk of the board; and provide copies of the recommendation, electronic recording, hearing record and notifications to each board member and the prosecuting attorney's office.

- (9) At the time, date and place that the Board of County Commissioners considers the written recommendation of the hearing examiner, no additional testimony or evidence will be considered. The record before the board will include the electronic recording of the hearing held by the examiner, the exhibits and other documents admitted into the hearing record by the examiner, the examiner's written recommendation, and the examiner's notifications to the parties. The board may ask the examiner to summarize the recommendation or clarify aspects of the recommendation, as long as no new testimony or evidence is provided or considered. The hearing examiner may bring clerical errors, obvious ambiguity or other irregularities in the written recommendation to the attention of the board in writing at or prior to the meeting, for the purpose of correcting or clarifying the recommendation.
- (10) The Board of County Commissioners may accept, reject or modify the hearing examiner's written recommendation; or may remand the matter to the examiner with direction for further consideration, if the board finds the written recommendation deficient or that a substantial procedural error regarding the hearing and affecting the rights of the parties was made by the examiner or SCRAPS. The board shall render its decision in writing.
- (11) If the decision of the Board of County Commissioners determines the dog to be dangerous or potentially dangerous, the owner or keeper of the dog may appeal the board's decision within twenty (20) days to superior court in accordance with RCW 36.32.330. If the owner or keeper does not appeal the board's decision determining the dog to be dangerous, or register the dog as a dangerous dog in accordance with section 5.04.035, within twenty (20) days, the dog if not in the possession of SCRAPS will be confiscated and euthanized at the direction of the director in an expeditious and humane manner.
- (12) If the decision of the Board of County Commissioners determining a dog to be dangerous is affirmed on appeal and no further appeal is taken, the owner or keeper of the dog must register the dog as a dangerous dog in accordance with section 5.04.035 within twenty (20) days of notification of the board's decision being affirmed, or the dog will be confiscated and euthanized at the direction of the director in an expeditious and humane manner.
- (13) A determination that a dog is not a dangerous dog shall not prevent the director from seeking to have the dog declared a dangerous dog as the result of any subsequent action by the dog.
- (14) An owner or keeper of a dangerous dog who violates any conditions imposed under this section shall be guilty of a gross misdemeanor. An owner or keeper of a potentially dangerous dog who violates any conditions imposed under this section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.

5.04.033 - Determination of potentially dangerous dog—Notice, administrative review, and appeal.

- (1) When the director has sufficient articulable information to determine that a dog is a potentially dangerous dog as defined in section 5.04.020(22), the director shall declare the dog potentially dangerous and shall notify the owner or keeper of the dog in writing of such determination, either in person or by regular mail. Any notice or determination mailed pursuant to this section shall be deemed received by the party to whom it is addressed on the third (3rd) day after it is placed in the mail, as set forth by declaration of the sender. The notice shall contain the following information:
 - (a) That the person receiving the notice is the owner or keeper of a potentially dangerous dog as defined in section 5.04.020(20);
 - (b) The breed, color, sex, and license number (if known) of said dog;
 - (c) The facts upon which the declaration of potentially dangerous dog is based;
 - (d) That if there are future similar incidents involving the dog, the dog could be declared a dangerous dog pursuant to section 5.04.032, and required to be registered as provided in section 5.04.035;
 - (e) That the owner or keeper must comply with restrictions set forth in the notice as a condition of continued ownership or keeping of the dog, and that restrictions may include but are not limited to those that may be imposed on the owner or keeper of a potentially dangerous dog pursuant to section 5.04.032(7);
 - (f) That the notice renders final the director's declaration that the dog is a potentially dangerous dog, unless the owner or keeper of the dog submits a request for an administrative review meeting to the director in writing on a form provided with the notice within fifteen (15) days of the receipt of the notice; and
 - (g) That a failure by the dog owner or keeper to request an administrative review meeting within the time provided in subsection (1)(f) of this section, or attend an administrative review meeting with the director after being duly notified of the meeting, shall constitute a failure to exhaust all administrative remedies, render final the director's declaration that the dog is potentially dangerous, and preclude any appeal of the director's declaration to the hearing examiner, Board of County Commissioners, or court.
- (2) The procedures and requirements described in subsections (1)(e) through (1)(g) of this section shall apply to the potentially dangerous dog declaration issued by the director, and to any review meeting or appeal requested by the dog owner or keeper regarding such declaration.
- (3) If the owner or keeper of a dog requests an administrative review meeting as described in subsection (1)(f) of this subsection, the meeting shall be scheduled within thirty (30) days of the receipt of the request. The meeting date may be continued by the director based on a showing of good cause. The director shall notify the owner or keeper of the date, time and place of the meeting; as well as the owner's or keeper's right to present evidence as to why the dog should not be found potentially dangerous, and the right to be represented by counsel at the meeting. Administrative review meetings shall be informal, open to public view, and at the option of the director held telephonically.
- (4) Following an administrative review meeting, the director may affirm or reverse the director's determination that the dog is potentially dangerous. If the determination is affirmed, the

director may impose the same reasonable conditions as may be imposed on the owner or keeper of a potentially dangerous dog pursuant to section 5.04.032(7).

- 5) The director shall notify the owner or keeper of the dog in writing of the director's decision, either by regular mail or in person, within ten (10) days of the administrative review meeting. The director's decision is final unless the owner or keeper submits a request for an administrative appeal hearing in the same manner and within the same timeframe as provided in section 5.04.032(2). The hearing, recommendation and decision procedures set forth in section 5.04.032 shall apply to the appeal.
- (6) The owner or keeper of the dog may appeal the Board of County Commissioner's decision to affirm the potentially dangerous dog determination within twenty (20) days to superior court in accordance with RCW 36.32.330.
- (7) An owner or keeper of a potentially dangerous dog who violates any of the conditions imposed under this section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.
- (8) Conditions imposed on a potentially dangerous dog under this section may be reviewed and modified at the discretion of the Director. Any modification of the conditions must be supported by written findings and conclusions issued by the Director, which will become final and effective fifteen (15) days after notice to the owner or keeper of the dog unless appealed. The notice and appeal of any modification of conditions shall be only of the changed conditions and shall follow the notice and appeal procedures contained in the section.
- (9) Dogs deemed potentially dangerous by other jurisdictions in the state of Washington shall be subject to the same regulations as if they have been deemed potentially dangerous in Spokane County and the owner or keeper shall present the dog to SCRAPS within thirty (30) days of their arrival in Spokane County in order to allow the Director to evaluate the dog on an individual basis and determine which restrictions authorized under this section to impose.



On March 15, 2023, Stephanie Hayden called Animal Protection Officer (APO) Rebekah Mason to report a bite incident that occurred at S.C.R.A.P.S. at 6815 E Trent. Hayden, a S.C.R.A.P.S. employee, advised that at approximately 2pm that day, she was walking "Oatmeal," a tan male large mix dog, back into the shelter after being outside. [REDACTED] a volunteer at S.C.R.A.P.S., approached after getting out of a vehicle. Hayden advised [REDACTED] to stay back as she was walking a behavior dog and he stopped walking. Hayden was struggling to unlock and open the door as "Oatmeal" was excited to return. [REDACTED] approached quickly from behind Hayden and reached over "Oatmeal" to pull the door open to the crematorium, where he had no business entering. "Oatmeal" lunged up at [REDACTED] and bit his arm, tearing skin. [REDACTED] retreated inside through a different door and Hayden was able to return "Oatmeal" to his kennel with no issues. "Oatmeal" was placed on a ten day bite quarantine and an investigation was initiated by Officer Mason.



[REDACTED] said that he did not hear any warning from Hayden prior to the incident, but saw Hayden struggling to open the door and the dog was "being a handful," so he said "here let me help you" and reached over "Oatmeal" for the doorknob. Hayden was on the left side of the dog and [REDACTED] came up on the right side of the dog, "Oatmeal" lunged up and bit [REDACTED] bicep deeply. Hayden pulled "Oatmeal" away after all his feet touched ground again and [REDACTED] pulled his arm away as soon as he felt the bite. [REDACTED] went inside S.C.R.A.P.S., was handed a clean towel and the shelter operations manager drove [REDACTED] to Spokane Valley Hospital for medical care. [REDACTED] received an unknown number of stitches, had blood vessels cauterized, and was given antibiotics and pain medication. [REDACTED] has a follow up appt scheduled in ten days and can take off the bandage in five days.</p> <p>On March 20, 2023 Officer Mason finalized her investigation, and determined the injury to be grossly out of proportion to the circumstance, with a level four bite: single bite with deep wounds. Officer Mason declared "Oatmeal" a dangerous dog due to inflicting severe injury on a human being. "Oatmeal" was previously found to be potentially dangerous because of a bite injury inflicted on a human, and the dog again aggressively bit and endangered the safety of another human. "Oatmeal" does not have bite inhibition and acting in the spirit of the law, Officer Mason declared "Oatmeal as dangerous and he will be euthanized for safety concerns.</p>

This is your notice that the Director of SCRAPS, or his/her designee, has sufficient information to determine that each dog described above is/are dangerous by SVMC 7.30.035 which refers to SCC 5.04.020(12) for definition of dangerous dog. Therefore, as of the date indicated above, your dog(s) is declared a dangerous dog.

Spokane County Code Section 5.04.020(12) defines a dangerous dog and states:

"Dangerous dog" means any dog that (a) inflicts severe injury or multiple bites on a human being without provocation on public or private property, (b) inflicts severe injury, multiple bites, or kills an animal without provocation while the dog is off the owner's or keeper's property, or (c) has previously been declared potentially dangerous under this chapter or a previous version of this chapter or under a comparable ordinance in any jurisdiction within the state of Washington, or under RCW 16.08.080, and after the owner or keeper received notice of such declaration the dog engages in behavior that meets the definition of "potentially dangerous dog" in subsection (22) of this section; provided, a declaration of dangerous dog under part (c) of this subsection cannot become a final determination under section 5.04.032 unless and until the previous declaration of potentially dangerous dog has become final under this code or a previous version of this code or under an comparable ordinance in any jurisdiction within the state of Washington, or under RCW 16.08.080. If two (2) or more dogs jointly engage in any conduct described in parts (a) or (b) of this subsection, thereby rendering proof of the individual dog that inflicted any particular injury difficult to ascertain, then regardless of the degree of participation by the individual dog(s), all such dogs shall be deemed dangerous dogs.

This preliminary declaration of dangerous dog is based upon records of SCRAPS, a copy of which is attached to this notice as "Attachment A" and incorporated into this document by reference. The referenced records may be supplemented with additional materials as they become available to SCRAPS.

At the time of the preliminary declaration of dangerous dog an administrative review will be scheduled with the Animal Protection Director or designee unless the owner or keeper chooses to euthanize the dog. If the preliminary declaration of dangerous dog is upheld the owner or keeper will have 15 days from the date the dog was declared dangerous to register the dog or appeal the determination. To appeal the determination the owner or keeper must file a notice of appeal with the animal control authority.

If you request an administrative appeal hearing, the hearing will be convened pursuant to subsection (C)(1) of the SVMC Section 7.30.035. At the administrative appeal hearing, the records of the director of SCRAPS, or his/her designee and any supplementary material shall be admissible to prove the dog is a dangerous dog. You may require the officer compiling the record to be present at the administrative appeal hearing. You may present evidence and examine witnesses present. During the administrative appeal meeting the burden will be upon the director or his/her designee, to establish by a preponderance of evidence that the dog is a dangerous dog.

Any dog declared dangerous pursuant to SVMC 7.30.35 (D) shall be immediately impounded until the owner registers the dog as dangerous in accordance with SVMC 7.30.045. The dog will be euthanized at the direction of the director or his/her designee unless the owner or keeper within fifteen days from the date the dog was declared preliminary dangerous registers the dog as a dangerous dog pursuant to SVMC 7.30.045 or appeals the determination.

If the owner or keeper appeals the dangerous dog declaration the dog must be registered provisionally pursuant to SVMC 7.30.45 or it will be held at the shelter at the owner's expense pending the results of the appeal.

Failure to comply with any of the requirements for owning or keeping a dangerous dog within the City of Spokane Valley pursuant to SVMC 7.30.045 may constitute a gross misdemeanor. A gross misdemeanor is punishable by up to one (1) year in jail, a fine of up to \$5,000.00 or by both such fine and imprisonment. In addition, upon your failure to comply with any of the requirements for owning or

keeping a dangerous dog within the boundaries of the City of Spokane Valley, SCRAPS may immediately impound your dog.

THE ABOVE PRELIMINARY DECLARATION OF DANGEROUS DOG IS FINAL, AND YOU WILL BE SUBJECT TO THE REQUIREMENTS FOR OWNING OR KEEPING A DANGEROUS DOG WITHIN THE CITY OF SPOKANE VALLEY, UNLESS YOU REQUEST A HEARING IN WRITING ON THE FORM PROVIDED WITH THIS NOTICE WITHIN FIFTEEN (15) DAYS OF THE RECEIPT OF THIS NOTICE. THIS NOTICE IS DEEMED RECEIVED THREE (3) DAYS AFTER BEING PLACED IN THE MAIL.

IF AN ADMINISTRATIVE APPEAL IS TIMELY REQUESTED, THE APPEAL SHALL BE HELD WITHIN TWENTY (20) DAYS OF THE RECEIPT OF YOUR REQUEST. YOU WILL BE NOTIFIED OF THE DATE, TIME AND PLACE FOR THIS HEARING. THE HEARING SHALL BE INFORMAL AND OPEN TO THE PUBLIC. YOU MAY APPEAL THE DECISION OF THE HEARING OFFICERS AS PROVIDED UNDER THE GENERAL LAWS OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON.

FOR YOUR INFORMATION AND CONVENIENCE, THE FOLLOWING IS A COPY OF SPOKANE VALLEY MUNICIPAL CODE SECTIONS 7.30.035 AND 7.30.045.

7.30.035 Declaration of dangerous dog determination – Appeals relating thereto.

A. When the animal control director or designee has sufficient information to determine that a dog is dangerous pursuant to Spokane County Code Section 5.04.020, the animal control director or designee shall make a preliminary declaration that the dog is dangerous.

In the event a preliminary determination is made that the dog is dangerous, animal control shall notify the dog owner or keeper in writing, either by personal delivery, or by regular mail and certified mail, return receipt requested.

Any notice or determination mailed pursuant to this section shall be deemed received by the party to which it is addressed on the third day after it is placed in the mail, as set forth by declaration of the sender.

B. The notice must state:

1. The statutory basis for the proposed action;
2. A description of the dog for which the declaration is sought (breed, color, sex and license number, if any);
3. The reasons the animal control director or designee considers the animal dangerous;
4. If the dog has been determined to be dangerous, then the controls stated in SVMC 7.30.045 shall apply; and
5. An explanation of the owner's or keeper's rights and the proper procedure for appealing a declaration that a dog is dangerous, including an appeal form.

C. Administrative Review After Preliminary Administrative Determination.

1. Preliminary Determination of Dangerous Dog. Prior to the animal control director or designee issuing a final determination that a dog is dangerous, the animal control director or designee shall notify the owner or keeper in writing that he or she is entitled to an opportunity to meet with the animal control director or designee, at which administrative review meeting the owner or keeper may give, orally or in writing, any reasons or information as to why the dog should not be declared dangerous. The notice shall state the date, time, and location of the administrative review meeting, which shall occur prior to the expiration of 15 calendar days following receipt of the notice. The owner or keeper may propose an alternative meeting date and time, but such administrative review meeting shall occur within the 15-day time period set forth in this section, and shall be on a date and time acceptable to the animal control director or designee.

2. After such administrative review meeting, the animal control director or designee shall issue a final determination, in the form of a written order, within 15 calendar days of the administrative review meeting. In the event the animal control director or designee declares a dog to be dangerous, the order shall include a recital of the authority for the action, a brief concise statement of the facts that support the determination, and the signature of the person who made the determination.

3. An order declaring a dog is dangerous shall be delivered to the dog owner or keeper in writing either by personal delivery, or by regular mail and certified mail, return receipt requested.

D. Any dog that is declared dangerous by the animal control director or designee, whether preliminary or final, shall be immediately impounded until the owner or keeper registers the dog as dangerous pursuant to SVMC 7.30.045. The owner or keeper shall have 15 days from the date the dog was declared dangerous to register the dog or appeal the determination pursuant to subsection F of this section. If the owner or keeper fails to register the dog or appeal the determination, the dog shall be euthanized at the direction of the animal control director or designee. If the owner or keeper appeals the dangerous dog declaration, pursuant to subsection F of this section, pending the outcome of the appeal, the dog shall be held at the shelter at the owner's expense at a rate established by the animal control authority.

E. The owner or keeper of a dog subject to a declaration that their dog is dangerous may appeal the final written determination to the hearing examiner within 15 days after issuance of the decision by filing a notice of appeal with the animal control authority. The hearing examiner may adopt appropriate hearing procedures where procedures are not otherwise provided herein. The hearing shall be held within 20 days after receipt of the notice of appeal, unless it is continued for good cause shown. The animal control director or designee shall notify the owner or keeper in writing of the date, time and location of the appeal hearing before the hearing examiner, and said notice shall be received at least five days before the hearing. The appeal hearing shall be recorded, and the hearing examiner may allow testimony and documents that are relevant to the administrative determination that the dog is dangerous. The owner or keeper of the dog may require, by at least two days' written notice, for the officer compiling the record to be present at the hearing. The owner or keeper of the dog may present evidence and examine witnesses present. The burden shall be on the animal control director to establish by a preponderance of the evidence that the dog is a dangerous dog.

F. The hearing examiner shall issue a written decision, and mail a copy of the decision to the dog owner or keeper, and to the animal control director or designee, within 15 days of the appeal hearing. The hearing examiner's decision shall accept, reject or modify the administrative determination that a dog is dangerous, and shall include findings of fact and conclusions of law that support the decision. The hearing examiner may modify the determination that a dog is dangerous to a determination that the dog is potentially dangerous, if the facts warrant, and impose any of the requirements pursuant to SVMC 7.30.040(D). The decision shall be given the effect of a final decision by the city council, and shall state that the decision may be appealed to superior court pursuant to Chapter 7.16 RCW within 20 days from the date the decision was received. If the decision upholds the administrative determination that a dog is dangerous, and the dog owner or keeper fails to timely register the dog or appeal the decision to superior court, the dog will be euthanized at the direction of the animal control director or designee. If the dog owner or keeper timely appeals the dangerous dog declaration, the dog shall be registered provisionally pursuant to SVMC 7.30.045(G) or, pending the outcome of the appeal, the dog will be held at the shelter at the owner's expense, at a rate established by the animal control authority.

G. A dangerous dog's owner or keeper who violates any condition imposed under this section shall be guilty of a gross misdemeanor.

7.30.045 Registration of dangerous dogs – Requirements – Annual fee.

A. The owner or keeper of a dangerous dog shall obtain a certificate of registration for such animal from Spokane County animal control within 15 days of a declaration of dangerous dog or within 15 days of the appeal decision if appealed pursuant to SVMC 7.30.035. No dangerous dog shall be returned by Spokane County animal control to anyone prior to the issuance of the certificate of registration. The certificate of registration shall be issued only if the owner or keeper of the dangerous dog presents sufficient proof at the discretion of the animal control director of some or all of the following:

1. A proper enclosure to confine a dangerous dog and posting of the premises with a clearly visible sign that there is a dangerous dog on the property. In addition, the owner shall conspicuously display a sign with a warning symbol that informs children of the presence of a dangerous dog;
2. A surety bond pursuant to RCW 16.08.080 as adopted or amended, issued by a surety insurer pursuant to Chapter 48.28 RCW in a form acceptable to Spokane County animal control in the sum of at least \$250,000, payable to any person injured by the dangerous dog, regardless of whether the injury occurs on or off the owner's or keeper's premises. Said surety bond shall provide for prior written notification to Spokane County animal control of cancellation or material change; or

A policy of liability insurance pursuant to RCW 16.08.080 as adopted or amended, such as homeowner's insurance, issued by an insurer pursuant to RCW Title 48 in the amount of at least \$250,000, with a maximum \$500.00 deductible, insuring the owner or keeper for any personal injuries inflicted by the dangerous dog regardless of whether the injury occurs on or off the owner's or keeper's premises. Said policy of liability insurance shall provide for prior written notification to Spokane County animal control of cancellation or material change, payable to any person for personal injuries;

Prior to the issuance of a certificate of registration, the owner or keeper of a dangerous dog shall also furnish to Spokane County animal control a complete copy of the surety bond or policy of liability insurance specified in this subsection (A)(2), and shall allow Spokane County animal control a reasonable time to review the bond or policy to determine whether the liability coverage is sufficient;

3. A muzzle and leash for the dangerous dog which has been approved by Spokane County animal control;
4. Keeping the dog indoors at all times, except when on a leash approved by Spokane County animal control, and under the actual physical control of the owner or keeper or a competent person at least 15 years of age;
5. Keeping the dog muzzled in a manner that will not cause injury to the dog or interfere with its vision or respiration, but will prevent it from biting any person or animal when outside a proper enclosure;
6. A microchip implant injected for identification purposes pursuant to Spokane County Code Section 5.04.036; and
7. The dangerous dog shall be spayed/neutered at the owner's expense to complete the registration. If the dangerous dog has previously been spayed/neutered, the owner or keeper of the dangerous dog shall provide sufficient proof of such spaying/neutering promptly to Spokane County animal control. Any impounded dangerous dog may be transported by Spokane County animal control to a veterinarian for spaying/neutering as part of the registration process.

B. In addition to the regular dog licensing fees pursuant to Spokane County Code Section 5.04.030, the owner or keeper of a dangerous dog shall pay an annual registration fee in the amount of \$100.00. The registration shall be valid for 12 months. Dangerous dog registration shall be renewed every 12 months. A reinspection of the facility is required prior to renewal. Prior to re-registration, the owner or keeper shall also provide Spokane County animal control proof of proper insurance or a surety bond pursuant to subsection A of this section.

C. This section shall not apply to police dogs as defined in RCW 4.24.410.

D. The owner or keeper of a dangerous dog shall notify Spokane County animal control, in writing, if the dog is deceased, if the dangerous dog is to be relocated, or if there is a change in ownership. In the event of a change of ownership and/or relocation of the dangerous dog, the owner or keeper shall provide Spokane County animal control with at least 10 days' prior written notice that includes the complete address and phone number of the new owner or keeper prior to the change of ownership and/or relocation of the dangerous dog. The owner or keeper of the dangerous dog shall also notify any subsequent owner or keeper of the dog's designation as a dangerous dog. If change of ownership and/or relocation of a dangerous dog is within Spokane County, all conditions imposed pursuant to this section shall be in place for the new owner and at the new location prior to such change.

E. Dogs deemed dangerous by other jurisdictions in the state of Washington shall be subject to the same regulations as if they have been deemed dangerous in Spokane County. Dogs deemed dangerous by jurisdictions outside of the state of Washington, whose owner or keeper seeks to relocate to the city, shall present such dog for evaluation by the Spokane County animal control director or designee, who may, on an individual basis, declare the animal dangerous pursuant to Spokane County Code Section 5.04.020(9). Dogs meeting the requirements of a dangerous dog pursuant to Spokane County Code Section 5.04.020(9) shall be registered as such, and are subject to all other restrictions imposed pursuant to this section.

F. An owner or keeper of a dog previously deemed dangerous by Spokane County animal control and subsequently relocated outside Spokane County shall register the dog pursuant to this section prior to bringing the dog into the City. Such dogs are prohibited from re-entering the City without prior written consent from Spokane County animal control and/or full re-registration.

G. Notwithstanding any other provision in this section, the animal control director may issue a provisional registration certificate under the following circumstances:

1. The dangerous dog declaration has been appealed pursuant to SVMC 7.30.035, provided all conditions pursuant to this section have been met, with the exception of subsection (A)(7) of this section requiring spay/neuter; or

2. The owner is relocating the dangerous dog outside Spokane County and all conditions pursuant to this section have been met, with the exception of subsection (A)(2) of this section requiring surety bond or liability insurance.

A provisional permit issued pursuant to subsection (G)(1) of this section shall expire 15 days following the appeal decision. A provisional permit issued pursuant to subsection (G)(2) of this section shall be valid for the sole purpose of immediate transport and relocation of the dangerous dog from the shelter to a location outside Spokane County.

H. A dangerous dog's owner or keeper who violates any conditions imposed pursuant to this section shall be guilty of a gross misdemeanor.

 - a. Proper enclosure, inspected and approved by SCRAPS, to confine a dangerous dog and posting of the premises with a clearly visible sign that displays a warning symbol that informs children of the presence of a dangerous dog.
 - b. A microchip implanted for identifications purposes pursuant to section 5.04.036.
 - c. A muzzle and leash approved by SCRAPS as to strength and fit.
 - d. A surety bond, or policy of liability insurance such as homeowner’s insurance, as described in this subsection, in the sum of at least two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000) with a maximum deductible of five hundred dollars (\$500) per dog.
 - e. The dangerous dog must be spayed/neutered at the owner’s expense in order to complete the registration. Any impounded dangerous dog will be transported by SCRAPS to a veterinarian for spaying/neutering as part of the registration process.
 - f. In addition to the regular dog licensing fees, the owner or keeper of a dangerous dog shall pay an annual registration fee in the amount of one hundred dollars (\$100) per dog. The registration will be valid for twelve (12) months.

2. **_____Appeal Dangerous Dog Declaration SVMC 7.30.035**
 - a. Prior to the director or designee issuing a final determination that a dog(s) is dangerous, an administrative review meeting will be held at which time the owner/keeper may give any reasons or information as to why the dog should not be declared dangerous.
 - b. Owner or Keeper may appeal the director or designees final determination. The appeal must be submitted in writing to the SCRAPS director on the form provided with this notice within fifteen (15) days of receipt of this notice.
 - c. If the Declaration is appealed, the dog must be registered provisionally or it will be held at the shelter at the owner's or keeper's expense pending the results of the appeal.

3. **_____Relocation – SCC 5.04.035(2)(b)**
 - a. A Dangerous Dog may be relocated outside of Spokane County. The complete address and phone number of the new owner or keeper must be provided to SCRAPS. SCRAPS will make contact with the appropriate jurisdiction in which the dog is being relocated to determine what, if any, restrictions will be in place on the dangerous dog in said jurisdiction. The new owner or keeper must be in compliance with that jurisdictions requirements prior to relocation. The dog will still need to be spayed/neutered and microchipped prior to leaving Spokane County.

4. **_____Owner release for Euthanasia**
 - a. An owner may release the dangerous dog to SCRAPS for euthanasia. If the dog has been involved in a bite it will remain at SCRAPS for the duration of the ten (10) day quarantine. Upon clearance of the quarantine the dog will be humanely euthanized at SCRAPS.

NOTE: The owner/keeper of a Dangerous Dog will be responsible for all fees incurred while the dog is impounded at SCRAPS. Fees may include, but are not limited to:

Board - \$15/day per dog

Impound - \$35 per dog

Microchip - \$25 per dog

Release - \$65 per dog

Trip fee - \$25

Dangerous Dog sign - \$8.70 each

Any vet bills that may be incurred while the dog(s) is impounded
