Chapter Honor Award

To qualify, a chapter must complete a total of ten (ten) related activities from the list below and must include the six (6) marked with an asterisk (*). Remember to keep record of these activities throughout the year.

- * Honor our founder, Dr. Rob Morris, in August.
- * No part of the Ritual is to be copied. (Page 167 in Ritual)
- * Exemplify the initiatory work, mock or real, two (2) times during the year.
- * Renew the obligation two (2) times during the year.
- * Provide the following educational programs and record in the minutes: 2 from the Ritual, 2 from the Constitution and Code of Laws, 2 from the Book of Instruction, 1 from the Chapter By-Laws and review the Secretary's Official Visit checklist.
- * Perform this year's Service Challenge by assisting our youth.
- Recognize and honor 25- and 50-year members.
- Honor Masons, Veterans and First Responders.
- Assign a prompter who has the only Ritual open during the meeting.
- Hold a friendship night or District fellowship meeting.
- Worthy Patron is to work with officers on proficiency of their work, Consider designating practice time other than stated meetings.
- Officers and members are encouraged to attend a practice with the Grand Instructor.
- Encourage 100% Officers attendance at School of Instruction.
- Collect "TABS" for the Shriners' Hospitals.
- Perform community service activities, such as volunteering at a nursing home or hospital, cleaning up parks or neighborhoods, donating blood. Report all community activities with pictures to the <u>Eastern Star Journal</u>.

Servíce Challenge:

Our Community Project is to work with and support the youth of Tennessee. Some examples are:

- Assist and encourage Rainbow Assemblies and DeMolay Chapters.
- Collect books and/or monetary contributions for your local library.
- Donate stuffed animals to law enforcement agencies so they can give to children who are removed from stressful or dangerous situations.
- Help with the various Scottish Rite Valleys' aid to our youth, e.g. the shoe program.
- Hold fund raising events to benefit our Youth Scholarship and Christian Scholarship programs.
- Start a chapter scholarship to assist the youth of your community.
- Adopt a family with children and provide food, clothes and toys anytime throughout the year but especially at Christmas.
- Support schools by providing supplies or giving donations.

Do not limit your efforts to the above examples in aiding the youth of our beautiful state but work to give a helping hand to our future .



Vísítatíon – Rolling with the Gnomies

Begin counting visits March 1, 2023 and end February 29, 2024. Appoint a chapter chairman.

- One visit for each chapter's stated, special or called meetings, including your own chapter meetings.
- One visit for each day attending Grand Chapter (up to 4). You may count other Grand Chapters attended.
- One visit for each official visit that you attend. Joint meetings count as two visits, if chapters have a quorum.
- One visit for each Grand Representative, Past Matron/Past Patron, Line Officer meeting and Section luncheons.
- One visit for each practice with Grand Instructor.
- One visit for each School of Instruction that you attend.
- One visit for attending Rainbow Assembly and/or DeMolay Conclave (up to 2 for each).
- One visit for each Masonic District meeting that you attend.
- Members will receive a visitation pin upon reaching twentyfive (25) visits.

Awards will be given at Grand Chapter for the most visits to the individual, the Chapter with less than 100 members and the Chapter with 100 or more members.

Past Grand Matrons, Past Grand Patrons, Grand Officers and "Promise Keepers" (trailers) are not eligible for the individual award but their visits will count toward the Chapter awards.



Commíttee Responsibilitíes

Benevolence Committee:

Appoint a Chapter chairman.

- Contact shut-ins and inactive members with phone calls, cards and visits.
- Remember our sisters on Eastern Star Maintenance with cards and gifts throughout the year.
- Work with the Chapter's Youth Committee Chairman to fulfill the Service Challenge, such as adopting a family with children at Christmas.
- Support local food banks, nursing homes, libraries and schools.
- Greet and welcome guest and new members.

Health Committee:

Appoint a Chapter chairman.

- Collect "TABS" for Shriners Hospitals or for a local charity. Keep records of these donations for the annual report to Grand Chapter.
- Provide education on two (2) health related topics.
- Donate bottled water or a meal to local First Responders (Police and Fire Departments, Rescue Squads).
- Provide water and snacks to hospital waiting rooms, treatment centers or blood drives.
- Donate travel size personal hygiene items for families staying away from home at a Ronald McDonald House, for example, and for women's abuse shelters.
- When possible, identify these items as being donated by the Order of the Eastern Star.

Youth Committee:

Appoint a Chapter chairman.

- Support Rainbow, DeMolay or any youth organization.
- Be responsible for fulfilling this year's Service Challenge in supporting our youth.

Commíttee Responsibilities

Masonic Relations and Masonic Charities Committee:

Appoint a Chapter chairman.

- Strive to strengthen relationships with all Masonic bodies.
- Honor the Masons during the year by providing food at their meetings and officer installations and assist in fund raisers.
- Hold a joint family social event, such as a meal, to show our appreciation to the Masons.
- Encourage all members, sisters and brothers, to attend a District Meeting.

Education and Membership Committee:

Appoint a Chapter chairman.

- Share the secretary's Official Visit checklist with the members.
- Contact all chapter members regarding information about meetings, projects and activities. Consider establishing a Chapter FaceBook page to provide this information. If you desire, this page can be private so only your Chapter members can view.
- Invite inactive members to attend Chapter stated and special meetings and participate in Chapter activities.
- Assign a "big sister" or "big brother" to new members and consider having an orientation for these members to discuss our Ritual, Book of
- Instruction, Constitution and Code of Laws and calendar.
- Assist and share your knowledge and experience to benefit others.



Membership Challenge Competition Rules

(An Aid to Encourage Membership Growth)

The Chapter with the highest total number of points will win the **Membership Challenge Trophy.** It will be awarded based on a point system as prescribed by the Worthy Grand Matron each year.

Points will be awarded as indicated below for the year 2023-2024 beginning April 1, 2023, and running through March 31, 2024.

- A chapter having no demits to other chapters in the state or suspension of members will receive 25 points.
- Each chapter that sustains a loss due to suspension or demit will lose 5 points for each suspension or demit.
- Each chapter that affiliates a new member from a chapter OUT of STATE will receive 5 points for each affiliating member.
- For each reinstatement, 15 points will be awarded.
- For each new member initiated, 10 points will be awarded; an additional 5 points will be awarded if the new member is an active member of the International Order of Rainbow for Girls.
- There will be no loss of points when a chapter suffers a loss due to death.
- In the event of a tie, the chapter gaining the most NEW members (those initiated) will be declared the winner.
- Dual membership within the state of Tennessee will not count toward the total score/points.
- In the event of chapters merging, the gaining chapter will receive 2 points for each member merging from the chapter surrendering its charter.
