# May 15 General Meeting and Spring Membership Show Closing Critique

The critique will be performed by the gifted and entrepreneurial **Frankie Johnson**, who has been teaching and managing her Mainstreet Art Center in Lake Zurich for almost 30 years. Last year she opened the Center's adjoining Mainstreet Gallery, featuring fine art from top national and local artists, staff members, and students.



Check out Frankie's excellent <u>website</u> to better understand the scope of her artistic interests. Select the "Blog" tab to view how she approaches the painting process.

One of her students reported that Frankie is "an incredible teacher with endless patience," who also challenges students' comfort zones in order to foster artistic growth.

After discussing each piece with the artists, Frankie will award  $1^{st}$ ,  $2^{nd}$ , and  $3^{rd}$  places. LCAL will no longer award Best of Show (once a common practice) as it detracts from the simplicity and intimacy of our spring and fall gatherings.

#### The 2024 LCAL 90<sup>th</sup> Anniversary celebration is only 8 months away!

The newly-appointed LCAL 90<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Committee (Deb Edmunds, Chris Tanner, Jeff Harold, Val Brandner, Gail Gudgeon, Clarese Orstein) met April 13 to start making firm plans for the celebration. Fran Isaac has subsequently joined the committee.

There is a lot to be done and **more team members would be welcome!** We will soon ask for the active support of all of our members to publicize our events, tell our story and build our membership.

As reported in April Sketches, Cora Davies started the LCAL 90 years ago, so she will become the **theme of our celebration**.

**Publicity** will be anchored by broad distribution of our 90th Anniversary poster. We will also use FaceBook and our website, and we are also targeting the Daily Herald, which has been known to tip off larger news organizations!

90 years ago, membership dues were only \$2.50, so **dues for new members** during the anniversary year will also be \$2.50!

The art will be draped with decorative netting, a nod to our earliest shows at Waukegan Harbor, when art was hung on fishermen's nets that were drying in the sun. **3. and 4. June and October shows** at the restored Starline Factory in Harvard, which is all about heritage, so our celebration will fit nicely with their setting and exceptional publicity.

5. Our fall membership show, in Waukegan's restored Carnegie Library during its widely-covered inaugural year.

So cross your fingers and patiently await a magical spring moment in the woods. It could be any day of the week, but it will be on a day that's at least partly sunny.

Expect newly emerged wildflowers in a wet, gray, mat of old rot and new winter detritus. While these green shoots and tiny pink-white blooms may challenge our artistic skills, they are refreshing evidence of an exciting, reemergent ecosystem.

#### Info Required for Submission

#### Please email the following to Jeff Harold by Fri, 5/12.

- 1) Photos of the work you are submitting (these don't need to be fancy)
- 2) Unframed size of the work
- 3) Medium
- 4) Selling price (all work must be for sale)
- 5) Title of the work

**When**: The show will run from early June through the 4th Fri Event.

**By entering the show you agree to** hold harmless any LCAL member transporting your artwork from accidental damage or lost.

If you have any concerns about damaged or lost artwork, you should have it insured.

You will be required to sign a hold harmless form for Starline that will be available during drop off of your artwork.

#### Art Dropoff:

There are 3 options for dropping off your work. (*Make sure your artwork is wrapped to safely travel.*)

1) Bring it to the May members meeting on 5/15. We will be collecting the work starting at 5:30pm.

2) Drop off your work at the Starline Factory in Harvard (waiting on date and time from Starline).

3) Drop off your work at Jeff Harold's house in Antioch

- Work must be dropped off by Fri, 5/26 Please call to arrange drop off date and time.
- <u>NOTE: I will be out of town from Tues, 5/16 through Fri, 5/19 and</u> won't be available to accept artwork during this time period.

#### Art Pickup Date:

#### Art Pickup Location:

# Thoughts from Jeff Harold: Old Friends

We have some old friends that spend the winters in the south, but they always return in the spring to spend the summer with us. We've enjoyed their company every year for at least 10 years. I photographed and recorded them when they had their first child, and then a few years later when they had twins. I've also caught them in their "romantic" moods. It's disappointing that, so far, they have not returned this spring to visit with us. I'll have to report their absence if they don't show up by June. How do I know that the sandhill crane pair that showed up this year were not our old friends? Our female friend had been "banded" as a breeding adult on 6/8/2013 by a graduate student from the Univ. of IL Urbana-Champaign to study her breeding success (talk about "1984"). I'm sure we'll enjoy our new friends, but I'll miss our old ones.

This got me thinking,.... how long do we need to be friends to be considered "old friends"? Those I've known for over 30 years are definitely "old friends". But what about those I've met in more recent years, especially some from the art league? I don't think there's a specific amount of time, it's more of the connection that you make with people.

But there's one that I think about every so often that makes me sad to have lost it. Back in the 1970's, I had my first camera and was traveling the backroads of Ohio in my 1967 VW Bug. I came to a crossroad in a little hamlet actually called "Sleepy Hallow". It had one building, a former general store back in the 1940's that was now an antique store. When first built, it was a tavern that the local rogues populated. It had a large display window where a cat was enjoying a catnap. What made this more interesting, and worthy of a picture, was the large painting of fish swimming right behind the cat (I called it "Catnap Dreams"). I've, unfortunately, lost that picture, but every once in a while, I'll look for it again, hoping that I'll finally find my "old friend" after all these years (hope springs eternal).

I have a few photos that I am more connection with than others. Some go back to the 1970's, some are more recent. To me, an artwork is an "old friend" when it reminds me of the past, or the connection that you had to a person, place, or time. I have one that always cheers me up when we get together. It's called "Sunny Side Up". Another happy friend for me is the photo of the Grand Tetons that I took at the moment I proposed to my wife.




Sunny Side Up
