





LCAL Spring Membership Show

The Lake County Art League (LCAL) has been doing a Spring Membership Show for 90 years, so we've gotten pretty good at it!

This year, the show is special because it will be the first of 6 shows that promise a nuanced view of what we in the LCAL do. This show is also special because:

- It will be hosted by the College of Lake County (CLC). Their Robert T. Wright Community Gallery of Art is well-known and widely respected.
- CLC students will be able to participate in the show and its concluding critique by becoming LCAL new members at the 1934 dues rate of \$2.50.
- CLC has already helped design posters for LCAL and has offered to publicize the show through their Facebook network. All 6 shows will use some variation of host publicity.
- This show will be a test of our ability to otherwise publicize our art opportunities through news articles, posters, handouts and networking.

- Must be tasteful and appropriate to the circumstance.
- Edge-wrapped canvases are acceptable.

LCAL 16 April Membership Meeting & Demonstration

This in-person meeting will be held at State Bank of the Lakes in Grayslake

Susan Ploughe will be providing an oil painting demonstration.

"Ploughe rhymes with blue (and glue and hullabaloo)!"

"People often comment on the variety of subject matter that I choose to paint. I never want to paint any one thing so often that I am tempted to do so in a formulaic way. I love the process of discovery, of figuring out how paint applied to a flat surface can come to life and evoke an emotional response. I like painting in situations where I am not quite sure how to get what I am seeing onto the canvas. There's a bit of a thrill that comes with the not-knowing, which is followed by delight when the subject miraculously begins to take shape!" - Susan

Susan holds a BFA in Painting from Carnegie Mellon University. A native of Pennsylvania, she has lived in Lake Zurich, IL, for 24 years. After many years of working as an illustrator and graphic designer, she turned to oil painting full time in 2002. Since then, her work has been juried into many respected shows, including the Oil Painters of America National Exhibition, and she has won awards in the OPA Eastern Regional, Salon International, the American Impressionist Society, Plein Air Easton and other exhibits.

Susan's work has appeared in articles in Southwest Art, American Art Collector, Fine Art Connoisseur, International Artist and American Artist magazines. Her paintings are in private and corporate collections around the world, and she paints portraits on commission.

Rachel Jacobsen received the LCAL scholarship for her charcoal drawing: "Walk this Way." Each year the art league awards two scholarships to Collage of Lake County (CLC) students.

- 1. The Phoebe Boyd scholarship is funded by the Boyd family in memory of Phoebe Boyd who was a long time member of the art league and passed away November 22, 1997.
- 2. The other scholarship is funded annually by our art league with funds from our member dues.

The recipient students are selected from art work they entered and were juried into the CLC Student Show in April of each year.

For the 2024 year, LCAL members Oliver Merriam, Mary Neely, and Clarese Ornstein will be choosing the recipients.

We will provide the dates and times for the show, which will be held in the Wright Gallery at the CLC in Grayslake and encourage all members to stop by and see the work of these talented artists.

Upcoming LCAL 2024 Officer Elections

At our April membership meeting, the nominating committee will present a recommended slate of officers for the following year (1 July 2024 to 1 July 2025).

We still need a member to volunteer to be nominated for Corresponding Secretary (a one-year post). Chris Tanner and Val Brandner each have served in this office for 10 or more years and are more than willing to talk to anyone interested in this office.

What are the Duties of the Corresponding Secretary (CS)?

- Serves as editor of the LCAL's two newsletters.
- Sends out League correspondence including notices of meetings and upcoming exhibits.
- Performs other duties that the Board of Directors may assign.
- Selects an assistant to aid in performing these duties.

This office represents an important continuity within our art league and is vital to the league's operation. The CS keeps informed of internal and external communications, which leads to a valuable understanding of art-league mechanics and the skills and needs of almost every member.

Creating the newsletters is a combined effort: the CS works with the board and members to created the content, and an assistant puts the content together in newsletter format. Jody Bennett has been the assistant this past year and has agreed to continue in that roll.

LCAL 90th Anniversary 2024: Update

Plans for Mary Haas' winning painting

We have selected Mary's painting that carries a viewer back to 1934. Some plans on how to most effectively use it include:

- Ann Rintz, curator of the CLC gallery, will work with her students to develop the poster design built around Mary's painting. The design will also include some words and phrases related to LCAL. As an example, the anniversary committee has written some free-verse poems that tell the LCAL story.
- Mary's painting will be displayed on an easel at all indoor events.
- As an homage to the 1950s, when Waukegan Harbor was home to a major fishery, the LCAL used to display its art on fishnets drying in the sun. The art displays during our 90th anniversary will incorporate that same fish-netting theme, uniting our story and history.

Publicizing anniversary events

It's important that our anniversary events draw the attention of the general public, especially the artistic community. Publicizing our events is one way to get the word out.

- We can bookend our celebration with articles about our anniversary.
- Announcements and articles can be submitted to the Daily Herald, which has lately been featuring half-page art articles written and submitted by art organizations.
- We can utilize the strong publicity programs available in some of our event venues.
- Our show and critique at the Carnegie Library will piggy back on regional interest.
- Forwarding our announcements of upcoming events, may lead to long-term networking patterns. Many of our announcements will end up forwarded as Facebook entries that complement our own Facebook announcement.

There will be plenty of 90th-anniversary-related tasks to volunteer for during the year. We appreciate everyone's help and dedication to the LCAL!




