PHS Awards Scholarships to Talented, Dedicated Students

The Polish Heritage Society of Grand Rapids awarded seven scholarships totaling \$6,000 in April to accomplished students who are attending Michigan colleges and universities to further their educations in everything from the health sciences to business.

Mary Ann Bergevin and Marilyn Lignell, who made up the society's scholarship committee, said the students were selected on the basis of their academic achievements, interests in extracurricular activities, community involvement and connections with Polish heritage. "Polish culture reveres learning and education," Lignell said. "As a way of furthering that tradition, our society has awarded scholarships to college students for more than 20 years.

"We are very proud of the accomplishments of this year's awardees, and we wish them the best of luck as they pursue their educational goals."

In addition to their scholarships, all of the students were named honorary student members of the Polish Heritage Society for 2020.

Emma and Grace Piasecki, sisters who graduated from Norton Shores High School, were each awarded \$750 to continue their studies at **Grand Valley State** University in Allendale. Emma Piasecki is furthering her education in prephysician's assistant studies, with the career goal of becoming a physician's assistant. She has been involved in volleyball, basketball, lacrosse, link crew and the National Honor Society. The Polish Heritage Society will not need to hold elections for officers and directors in May because no one has challenged any of the individuals who appeared on the slate of candidates from April. Teresa Bonham will be a newcomer to the board as director on June 1, while all the other candidates have been current members of the board.

On June 1, the following

individuals have been reelected to their current positions for terms ending in May 2022: Mary Ann Bergiven, Treasurer; Elena Chaidez, Corresponding Secretary; and Michael Jasperse, Director.

There are changes in the leadership of the society when the following individuals take their positions: Adam Porczynski, President, with the term ending 2021; John Theisen, First Vice President for the term

ending 2021; Anthony Zasuwa, Second Vice President with the term ending 2022; and Bonham, director with term ending in 2021.

Bonham was nominated to serve as Second Vice President, but she and Zasuwa decided to switch positions to allow her to become acquainted with the board and its operation before taking on additional responsibilities. Zasuwa has been serving on the board

for several years and is active in the operation of the Grand Rapids chapter of the P.R.C.U.A. Malbork Dance Group.

There was a general shakeup of the board this year on several positions not up for reelection when Greg Rosloniec, who started serving as president in June 2019, decided to step down.

Scholarships are awarded to students who attend Grand Valley State University, Aquinas College, Davenport University, and Grand Rapids Community College. In addition, our society awards universal scholarships for those attending any college or university in Michigan. Scholarships will be awarded based on the following criteria:

- Must be a full-time student with a minimum 2.75 GPA.
- All recipients must be of Polish descent, and must provide a brief statement (signed and dated)
 delineating their heritage.
- Financial need will be

taken into consideration.
All applications must be received by the Financial Aid Office by March 15 in the year they are awarded.

All applications must be received by the Financial Aid Office by March 15. The colleges will provide the Polish Heritage Society with the applications. The Polish Heritage Society will select the recipients, and notify the Financial Aid Office of the dollar amount that the recipient will be awarded. This will be done within one month of receiving the list of scholarship candidates.
