PHS Awards \$5,000 in Scholarships to Top Students

The Polish Heritage Society of Grand Rapids awarded five scholarships totaling \$5,000 in April to accomplished students who are attending Michigan colleges and universities to further their education in everything from the health sciences to statistics.

Teresa Bonham, Marilyn Lignell, and Mary Ann Bergevin, who made up the society's scholarship committee, said the students were selected on the basis of their academic achievements, interests in extracurricular activities, community involvement and connections with Polish heritage. "Polish culture reveres learning and education," Lignell said. "As a way of furthering that tradition, our society has awarded scholarships to college students for more than 20 years.

"We are very proud of the accomplishments of this year's awardees, and we wish them the best of luck as they pursue their educational goals."

In addition to their scholarships, all of the students were named honorary student members of the Polish Heritage Society for 2023.

Kayla Van Linden, a graduate of West Catholic High School, was awarded a \$1,000 scholarship to continue her studies at Aquinas College in either the premed or pre-dental program.

She has participated in the high school yearbook, bowling, pho-

Abigail Wrzesinski, a graduate of L'Anse Creuse High School, was awarded a \$1,000 scholarship to continue her studies at Oakland University in the field of sociology, with a career goal of becoming a prosecuting attorney.

PHS to Hold Election for Directors

For the first time in recent memory, the Polish Heritage Society will be holding an election at its May meeting to fill three positions for General Director.

All active members of the society are eligible to cast votes at the election to be held at 6:30 pm, May 15 at the Polish Falcons Hall, 957 Fulton St SW. To be considered active, an individual needs to be a life member or have annual dues current.

Four candidates for General Director have been approved by the society's Nominating Committee to vie for the three available seats: Martin Rogalski, Thaddeus Szyszlowski, Thaddeus Broda and Rosemary (Prusinski) Maciejewski.

In addition to filling the three

General Director positions, the election will also fill three officer positions – but these individuals are running unopposed. The three individuals are Teresa Bonham for President, John Theisen for 1st Vice President and Matthew Gryczan for Recording Secretary.

In past years, no elections were held as the total number of candidates always matched the number of available seats open.

In March and April, newcomers Broda and Maciejewski submitted their names to be placed on the ballot, putting them in contention with incumbents Rogalski and Szyszlowski for General Director seats.

Maciejewski, 64, has been active for years in setup, teardown and acting as bar manager for the

He and his spouse wife Hanna have two children, Natalie and Eugene. He said he wants to serve on the board to "help everyone celebrate the rich and beautiful history that we have here in Grand Rapids."

Ballots will be distributed at the meeting with the offices and candidates listed. Voters will be asked to cast no more than three votes for General Director, out of four names listed. If a person casts four votes for General Director, his or her ballot will be disqualified. The election committee will tabulate the votes, and winners will be declared by simple majority by the end of the meeting. The ballots will then be destroyed.

The April PHS newsletter incorrectly stated that the election would be held at the society's June general meeting. The installation of officers and directors will take place at the general meeting to be held noon June 25 at Oriole Park, 1380 42nd St. SW in Wyoming.
