Dear Parents and Carers,

We have had a great start to the term and have hit the ground running with lots of exciting activities and great learning happening across the school

Our theme this half term is Feeling Grateful and our quest for the half term is Find a Positive Mental Gr-attitude! We all know how easy it can be to focus on the things that go wrong or are difficult, so this half term we want to focus on the importance of feeling grateful for all the great things we experience, especially the ones that we can sometimes take for granted. Research has shown that focusing on what you are grateful for, for example by keeping a gratitude journal, can have a real and positive impact of your well being. As part of our Gen H journey, we want all our children to be able to develop their resilience and feeling grateful is part of that development. We are reading the book, Feeling Grateful by Kobi Yamada, this half term and it is a wonderful book full of lots of thoughts and ideas that the children will be discussing at school. This week and next, as part of our quest, we have been thinking of three things each day that we are grateful for - it would be great if you can be doing this at home tool As Kobi Yamada says, "Look closely. The extraordinary is hidden in the ordinary. It is in the appreciation of something that we really begin to see it"

Our community has been celebrating and observing a wide range of festivals over the last few weeks, all of which have the message of gratitude running through them. On Monday, our Jewish families celebrated Passover and at school, the children were learning about this festival in class. In assembly on Monday, we were very lucky to have a former pupil here as a guest speaker. She came to share with us about her Umrah experience when she went to Mecca over Ramadan and Eid. The children listened brilliantly and asked some really interesting questions. Thank you to Maryam for taking the time to prepare such a great assembly.

The PTA have been very busy as always. Thank you everyone who has been supporting them. The Pre-loved Uniform sale was a great success and we had the y4 bake sale today. There are some really brilliant cooks in this school! Thank you everyone who contributed and helped out. Next up, we have the Pizza and Cookie night so don't forget to get your orders in!

Year 6 have been working extremely hard as we enter into the last 2 weeks before SATs. A huge well done to all our amazing children, who putting in such effort and demonstrating the great ambition that they have for themselves. We are very proud of them all!

We had lots of applications across KS2 and a huge number from Year 3 so we have decided to have our Year 3 Eco Warrior team who are going to help keep the school looking good, and then our Eco-committee of 10 children from year 4-6.
