FAQ: I work for an organization and would like to refer a client to your program. How do I make sure she would qualify?

We welcome referrals from program staff. Please review our qualifications to make sure your client will qualify:

- Client must have at least one of her children living with her.
- Children must be between the ages of infant and twelve years old.
- If the client is a victim of domestic violence, the perpetrator must not be actively looking for the client and considered to be dangerous.
- If the client is coming from a rehabilitation center, she must be clean/sober for 9 months.
- Client must be willing and able to work within 60 days of moving into Pacific Lifeline.
- NEED TO HAVE CURRENT COVID VACCINATIONS W/RECORDS
