


I WANT YOU TO VOLUNTEER Professor Vilfredo Pareto was an inquisitive fellow. In 1906 he published a paper, Political Economics, in which he stated that his careful research showed that 20% of the citizens of Italy owned 80% of the land. He also cited other examples of this 20/80 phenomenon. Since the early 1940s this has become popularized as the Pareto Principle, or the 80/20 law. Essentially it holds that 80% of results are the result of 20% of the causes.

SGAA is an example of this principle. Of our roughly 200 members, about 40 volunteer as officers, committee members or table workers. Interestingly, these 40 or so fill more than 60 positions; some fill as many as 3 positions—and most of these have been members for over 10 years.

We appreciate the diligent work of these volunteers. But we need new faces in some of these volunteer positions. Officers, directors and committees are in place for 2024, but we vitally need table workers. We urge you to consider volunteering for a table position. It's not rocket science; just look who's doing it now. Contact any table captain or officer for more information about the position. And consider running for an office, the board, or joining a committee this fall.

Incidentally, the board has created an award for Volunteer of the Year, and the first recipient will be recognized at our year end banquet. The award is named in honor of Claude Rhen who is a model volunteer. Claude served as a director and board member and served two terms as President. He continues to provide support for our data processing system and reporting.

I volunteered to be a substitute table worker a few times last year just to get a better understanding of the scoring and awards process for the SGAA. I've always been a "numbers guy" and I enjoy working with data and spreadsheets. This year I became a fulltime member of the Tuesday table. With our Table Captain (John Cyran) currently on the injured list, I've gained some firsthand experience with regard to how much work goes into making it possible for us to have local tournaments two to three times per week for eleven months out of the year. I'd like to share a little bit of that with you.

Before the season begins, the In-town Scheduling Committee headed by Jeff Hyland has to go to every Atlanta-area golf course that we want to have on our schedule for the upcoming year and negotiate a new contract. Tournament dates, availability of range balls and coffee and pricing are discussed and finalized. The location and dates of SGAA's Annual Tournament are also determined.

During the season, the table captain (or a designated table member) receives all of the registration requests submitted by the members for a tournament and manually prepares the tee sheet. He also contacts a golf course representative one week before play and two days before play to confirm that we are on the course's schedule and to give them an estimated number of golfers that will play.

On the day of the tournament, the table members make modifications to the tee sheets due to walk -up players or cancellations, enter players' names into the computer, collect table fees, note starting hole and course adjustments on the scorecards and coordinate placement/collection of closest-to-the-pin markers before the round. Upon completion of the round, the table verifies that the scorecards are correct and inputs the data (score, birdies/eagles/HIO, closest-to-the-pin) for each golfer into the computer and the program tabulates the scores by flight and the tournament results. The table captains send the reports to the web master (John Cyran) to be posted online. They also go to the bank and deposit the table fees in SGAA's account after each tournament.



Much of what these valued volunteers do is taken for granted because our process runs relatively seamlessly. We should all be thankful for the hard work that went into developing the process and for those who make it work before, during and after every tournament. Take a moment to let these hardworking volunteers know how much you appreciate their efforts!

Membership, and membership growth in particular, has become the priority focal point of this year. The number of members we have is a very important factor in several areas of our activities. You, or I, could show up to a golf course to play golf and we'd be charged the "going rate" just like everyone else. However, when Jeff Hyland goes to the courses to arrange for our tournaments he brings along the entire membership and its potential as leverage in securing the cost of green fees and dates of play. So the size of our membership is important.

There's been a rumor circulating that consideration is being given to removing the requirement of having two members sign off on (sponsor) new members. To change this will require a change to our By-Laws; a change I caution against making. Fortunately, I have been advised this rumor is just that a rumor.

The Membership Application was being updated and the sponsor's names were moved to the bottom of the application under the heading "To be completed by SGAA".

Apparently some of the discussion about the format for the updated Membership Application included the suggestion to remove the sponsors' signatures from the upper section. The concern was that potential members might not be applying for membership because of the requirement on the form to list two sponsors. It was decided that SGAA would assign two sponsors to potential members and eliminate that hurdle for applicants. If the applicant does know one or two current members they will be the sponsors. The requirement for two sponsors is still in effect.

While membership quantity is important, quality of membership is just as important. There are few of us that don't get frustrated from time to time while on the course whether it be from an errant shot, slow play, or a myriad of other factors. While it's understandable, how we handle that frustration reflects upon all of our membership. We haven't had any fights, no one has damaged the course in a fit of anger and the courses appreciate our patronage.

While we might lose a potential member if they are indeed intimidated by that requirement; the need to protect the integrity of our membership process and maintain the quality of members far outweighs the loss.
